## NEW ENGLAND PASTOR

Thank you for your interest in writing. *New England Pastor* is a bi-monthly magazine for pastors in New England. Ellen White had a clear vision for the work returning to the East. Over a century ago, she penned the words, "I saw that when the *message* shall increase greatly in power, then the providence of God will open and prepare the way in the East for much more to be accomplished than can be at the present time" (*Testimonies for the Church*, vol. 1, p. 149, emphasis added).

Similarly, she also wrote, "Instruction has been given me that the *message* should go again with power in the cities in the Eastern States. . . . There is a world to be saved; there are souls to be labored for in the cities of the East, in the states where the message of the coming of our Lord was first preached. Who will give themselves to do this line of missionary work?" (*Testimonies for the Church*, vol. 9, pp. 98, 134, emphasis added).

Her emphasis was clearly on the message, rather than methods or elaborate strategies. This is also evident in a statement she made in 1890, saying, "One interest will prevail, one subject will swallow up every other,—Christ our righteousness" (*Review and Herald*, Dec. 23, 1890).

Thus, in keeping with this testimony, *New England Pastor* seeks to uplift the message of Righteousness by Faith, encouraging pastors to deepen their appreciation for the beauty and truths of the gospel. When rightly understood and proclaimed—and Christ is lifted up—the work will spread with power.

## **General Guidelines**

- Every article should be prayerfully written within the context of Righteousness by Faith. Make Christ and Him crucified the foundation of the subject matter.
- Make the article readable. Salt it with illustrations and stories. As a general reference, the style should fit somewhere between scholarly and popular.
- Feature articles should be between 1,000-1,800 words.
- If asked to write an editorial or column, it should be approximately 750 words.
- Identify the Bible version you are using.
- Place your references as endnotes in Turabian style. Although acceptable to some degree, don't write a lot of additional information in the endnotes.
- All articles should be e-mailed as doubled-spaced Word document attachments to newenglandpastor@gmail.com.
- In addition to e-mailing the article, please include a short bio sketch and attach a picture of yourself.
- Please send your mailing address, so a complimentary copy of the issue your article is featured in can be sent to you.
- Writing and submitting an article does not guarantee that it will be used. If it is, it could take up to a year to before it is published.
