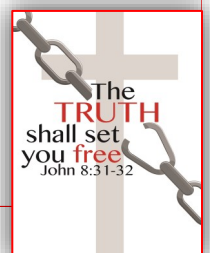

RINGFEST

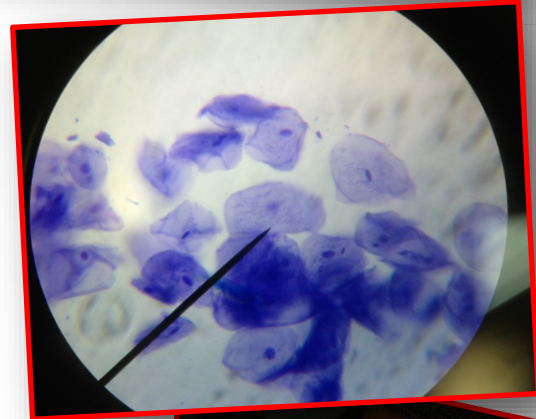

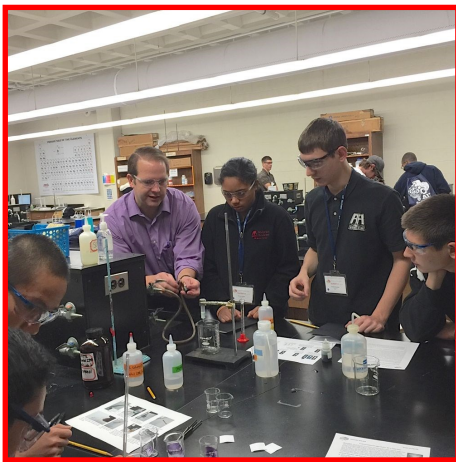
