I am amazed at the quality of people that affect the lives of our young people. Andrews Academy is so blessed to have such loving and caring faculty and staff members. The other day, I overheard a student say, "Mr. Sherman rocks! He....". The student was somewhat embarrassed that I was walking behind her, but she continued her thought so that I could hear what she was saying. I loved her reason for thinking that her history teacher is wonderful! We are truly blessed to have adults who make such a difference.

This weekend, I spent 20+ hours watching our young people play basketball at the Cardinal Classic. I was so proud of their play, attitude, and athleticism. We have totally awesome kids. I was also really impressed by the adults leading out in the coaching. I observed Jesus in so many of them. I saw Mr. J.B. McMillan place his hand on a discouraged player. He looked at him compassionately and made a

statement of affirmation. During the Cardinal Classic games, I spoke with an alum of AA who informed me that "if it weren't for Mr. D and Mr. von Dorpowski's influence and guidance, they couldn't have made it, stating "Mr. O, they were examples of Jesus to me not just basketball coaches." During the games, one of the visiting coaches came up to me and said "your coaches have such a terrific reputation, Bob. They are truly models for all coaches in our Adventist system. They are truly Godly leaders."

This was such a powerful reminder of what is found in the book of 1 Corinthians 11:1 where it states being imitators of Jesus. This weekend really caused me to reflect on that question, "Am I a reflector of Jesus? Am I making a difference in the lives of young people?" I am hoping to answer that question affirmatively each day. I challenge you to ask the question of yourself as well.

Here are the guidelines:

#### Motto

- 3. A phrase with a rhythm to it
- 4. A phrase emphasizing the academic, spiritual, and relational excellence of AA. Phrase must be short, about 3 to 6 words. Students may enter more than once. All English classes will have a "special" time set aside for guidance and instruction. All AA students are eligible. The winning motto will receive the following

- 7. Student's picture and motto will be featured on a poster and placed in a visible spot in the commons




