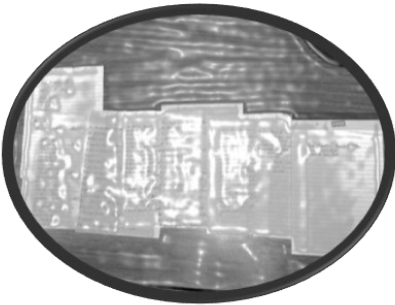

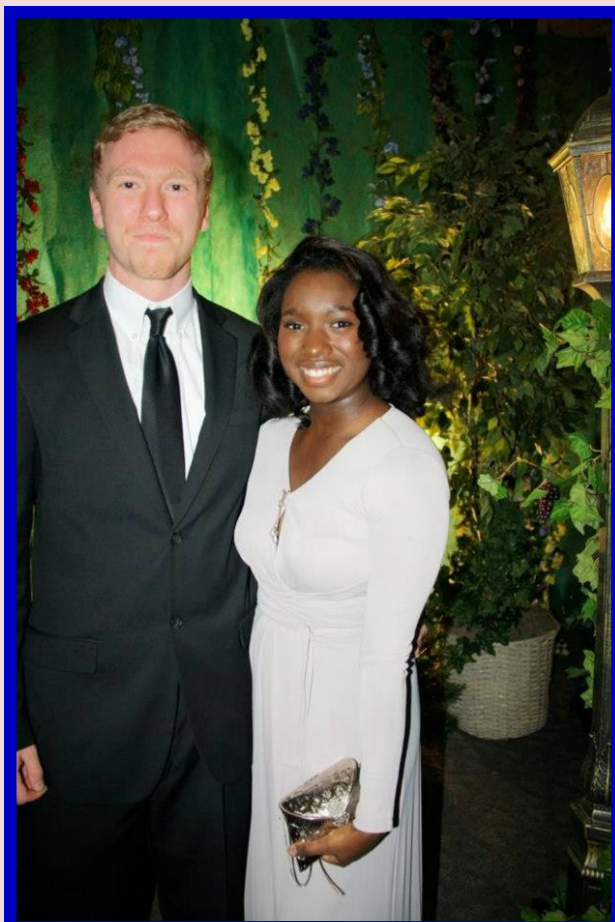

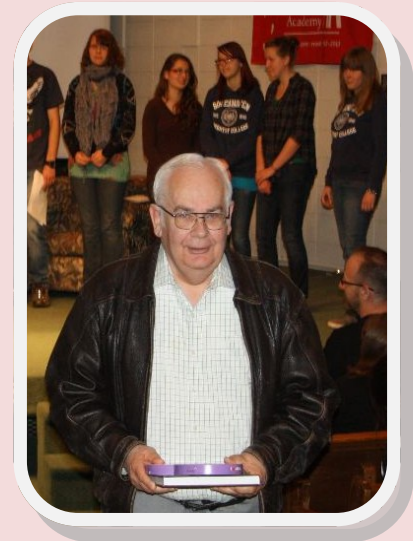


# Morning Devotions



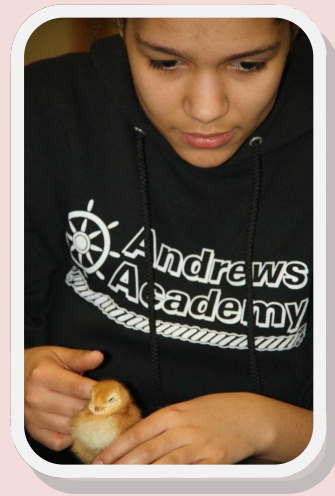
