### THERE IS NO TUITION INCREASE FOR THE 2013-14 SCHOOL YEAR.

Our Merit based scholarship program has been discontinued. The current merit scholarships will conclude at the end of the 2012-13 school year. Due to this, we are reinstating our Family Discount Program. Here is the voted action regarding the family discount:

<u>Voted:</u> **FAMILY DISCOUNT-** A family tuition discount program is offered to parents who support two or more of their children enrolled at Andrews Academy. In instances when a family supports a combination of two or more of their children enrolled at Andrews Academy and a Southwest Michigan SDA elementary school, a tuition discount is available when two conditions are met. These conditions are that the operating subsidies from the sponsoring Adventist church must equal \$15 per member per year and that the church must also offer a similar discount. At the present time Ruth Murdoch as sponsored by Pioneer Memorial Church qualifies for this discount. In instances when the conditions are met, the discount rate is figured at 5% for two supported children, and 10% for three or more supported children. Both students must be enrolled full time to qualify.














### Awards Assembly


