ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS FUNDED BY ANDREWS UNIVERSITY

The Andrews Partnership Scholarship is new for the 2002-2003 school year. The scholarship reflects the university's desire to recognize academic achievement as well as assist students in achieving a degree in a Seventh-day Adventist Christian environment.

ANDREWS PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Merit-based. Andrews Partnership Scholarship is available to all undergraduates including Canadian and international students. Their scholarships will be determined by the Admissions Office for incoming freshmen and transfer students. Incoming freshmen (without college credits) accepted to Andrews University will be awarded an Andrews Partnership Scholarship. The Undergraduate Admissions Office will determine a rating based on the following guidelines:

- Confirmed U.S. SAT or ACT scores
- Confirmed U.S. cumulative GPA (following the conclusion of the seventh semester for academy)
- or high school)

For non-United States and Canadian students, contact the Undergraduate Admissions Office for further details. Andrews Partnership Scholarship for merit-based scholarship level will be as follows:

Need-based. The scholarship level for undergraduate financial aid recipients (U.S. and eligible non-citizens) will be determined the same as for the merit-based recipients. Andrews University guarantees that between 50 and 65% of the student's need will be met with gift funds including the Andrews Partnership Scholarship. This is a seirous commitment by Andrews University to help students and their families afford Andrews University as well as possibly reducing loan indebtedness. To be eligible for this gift aid, students must complete the financial aid application process, which includes: file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), mail to Student Financial Services the Financial Information Sheet, Worksheets, W2s along with completed and signed 2001 Federal Tax Returns for parents and students. The priority processing date is March 31. No award letters will be mailed until Student Financial Services receives and processes these forms.

Continuing Undergraduate Full-time Students enrolled in their first degree program may also be eligible for an Andrews Partnership Scholarship. The scholarship amount is based on the student's cumulative overall GPA at the conclusion of Fall Semester 2001. Andrews Partnership Scholarship for continuing students will be:

Transfer Students to Andrews University who are full-time undergraduates and in their first degree program may be eligible for an Andrews Partnership Scholarship. Based on their college GPA, the Undergraduate Admissions Office will grant a scholarship based on the same levels as the continuing student. Refer to the chart above.

National Merit Finalist Scholarship. Andrews University rewards National Merit Finalists with an Andrews Partnership Scholarship that covers 100% tuition for four years for incoming freshmen. To confirm receipt of the scholarship, submit appropriate records to the Undergraduate Admissions Office.

Leadership Scholarship. Recruiting officers may award a onetime Leadership Scholarship of up to \$500 to incoming freshmen in recognition of their leadership accomplishments.

Student Missionary/Taskforce Volunteer Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to an undergraduate student who has served as a Student Missionary or Taskforce Volunteer and enrolls full time at Andrews University the year following the year of service. The \$1,000 scholarship is a one-year award divided over two semesters. It is not transferable to any other school nor any other student. Approval for this scholarship is given by the Director of the Student Missionary/Taskforce Volunteer Program in the Campus Ministries Office.

Named Scholarships. Endowments from alumni and friends of the university provide specially named scholarships as part of merit-based Andrews Partnership Scholarship. Selected students are awarded by their school a named scholarship based on academic performance, declared major, and career goals. To be eligible for consideration, students must have an overall GPA of at least 3.00 and a good citizenship record.

Continuing Eligibility. To maintain the Andrews Partnership Scholarship each student must meet all of the following:

- Meet the university's Satisfactory Academic Progress policy
- Complete a four-year degree in nine semesters or get permission for an extension from the appropriate dean
- Be a full-time (minimum 12 credit hours) undergraduate completing his/her first degree
- Be a full-time (minimum 12 credit hours) student on the Andrews University main campus

Included and Excluded Funds. Andrews Partnership Scholarships may include Andrews University grants, named scholarships, departmental scholarships, value of spouse free tuition. Funds not included in the Andrews Partnership Scholarship are Summer Ministries, Student Missionary, General Conference Missionary Matching, Undergraduate Research grants, employer-provided scholarship or assistance, and non-Andrews outside resources.
