## Search Guide for CSA Illumina Databases

### Getting Started

Select the database(s) you wish to search.

1. You may search as many CSA databases as you wish. To search more than one database, click on **Specific Databases**.
2. Mark the databases you need.
3. Click on **Continue to Search**.

#### Why Use?

Access databases:  
*PsycInfo, Social Services Abstracts, Sociological Abstracts, ERIC, MLA etc.*

#### Access Path:

From the home page (<http://www.andrews.edu/library>), click on **Articles/Databases**, then **Search by Subject or Search by Data-base Title**.

## Advanced Search

Using the Advanced Search screen gives more options.

1. Enter search term(s).
2. Select field you wish to search.
3. Select correct Boolean Operator.
4. Choose appropriate date range.
5. Add additional search options if desired.
6. Click **Search**.

### *Boolean Operators*

**And** retrieves sources with both terms:  
“abortion **and** teens.”

**Or** looks for at least one of similar terms:  
“adolescent **or** teen.”

**Not** locates records without a certain term:  
“child **not** infant.”

## Viewing the Results

1. Note the number of records retrieved.
2. Click tab to select publication type.
3. You may sort by date or relevance.
4. Click on a title to view the full record.
5. Click in box to mark a record.
6. Click **Save, Print, Email** to view the records you selected as a group.

### Tip

Descriptors are given to the right of the citation to help you narrow or refine your search.

## Save, Print, Email

1. Select the number of records you want to save, print, or email.
2. Click on full or brief format.
3. To email, fill in email address and click on **Email**.
4. To save, select file format and click on **Save**.
5. To create a bibliography, choose a **document format** and **bibliographic style**, then click on **Create**. You may print, save or email the bibliography.
6. To print, click on **Print Preview**, then print.

### Article Text

CSA Illumina only has citations. To access the text of an article, go to the library Website, click on **Articles/Databases** then **Periodicals A-Z**. Enter the journal's title.
