Uriah Smith/Mark Bovee Collection (Collection 146)

Scope and Content

The Smith/Bovee collection is one of the most substantial familial collections of core early Sabbatarian Adventist materials in the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The collection contains two distinct types of materials: those relating to Uriah Smith (1832-1903), and those of his grandson, Mark Leon Bovee (1899-1990). Together they compliment each other by document three generations of life as Seventh-day Adventists.

Uriah Smith was born in West Wilton, New Hampshire the youngest of four children born to Samuel (d. 1852) and Rebekah Smith (d. 1875). One of the earliest artifacts in this collection is a childhood crutch that Uriah used as the result of his leg amputation at the age of 8 from a severe infection (artifact #000409). Samuel and Rebekah Smith became Millerites and it appears that it was their deep interesting religion that moved Uriah to become an Adventist. From 1848 to 1851 Uriah attended nearby Exeter Academy. This collection contains a pencil sketch that Uriah drew from that period (Box 1, Fld 3) which shows Uriah's budding creative talent. About 1852 Uriah became a Sabbatarian Adventist, and the following year James White invited Uriah to join his older sister, Annie (1828-1855) to become a part of the *Review and Herald* staff in Rochester, New York (Box 1, Fld 41). As James and Ellen White traveled they increasingly left the office in the charge of these two young persons. Unfortunately, misfortune would strike in 1855 when Annie contracted tuberculosis and died. Later that year Uriah moved with the publishing staff and meager resources to Battle Creek, Michigan and it was that same year that his name first appears as Editor of the *Review and Herald*—a position he would hold for more than 40 years.

At some point in the 1850s Uriah met Harriet Newell Stevens (1831-1911), the daughter of Cyprian (1794-1858) and Almira T. Stevens (1803-1873). The Stevens family were well-known Adventists from Paris, Maine with whom the Whites lived for a brief period in 1850. About 1855 the Stevens family moved west to Waukon, Iowa where a number of other Adventists families had bought farms. At the very least Uriah and Harriet began to exchange love letters (Box 1, Fld 42). On June 7, 1857 the young couple were married by the first resident minister of Battle Creek, J. B. Frisbie (see their marriage certificate [Box 1, Fld 5]).

The newlyweds set up their home on a lot adjoining the publishing house. As the fledgling church grew so did Uriah's responsibilities. Uriah was appointed an elder of the group which met in the Advent meeting house and ordained as an Adventist minister. As time went on he became responsible not only as general editor, but also as proof reader, business manager, and bookkeeper. By 1869 this led to his health breaking down and a well-needed change in the pace of life. By 1871 he had resumed his editorship, but left in 1873 after a disagreement he had with James White. The Smiths moved to Grand Rapids, Michigan for about 6 months where he worked as an engraver (see the artifact of his wood glass pane advertising his services #000435).

Despite these brief interludes, Uriah's vantage point as editor of the *Review and Herald* allowed him in a very special way monitor and contribute to the organizational, theological, and spiritual development of the Seventh-day Adventist Church (organized officially in 1863). Historians today will want to pay particular attention to the early correspondence found in this collection between the Smiths and other church leaders. Of special significance are several previously unknown letters by Ellen White to the Smiths. Copies have now been added to the letters files of the Ellen G. White Estate (Box 2, Fld 5-7; now published as Lt 23, 1867; Lt 32, 1868; Lt 146, 1893). A second major area of significance are Uriah Smith's writings. In this collection are both Uriah's published and unpublished writings. His most famous work, *Daniel and Revelation*, first published in 1865 is in this collection. This collection contains two copies of this book with his handwritten corrections.

The collection reveals intimate details into the family life of the Smiths. After the Smiths returned to Battle Creek in 1873 they commissioned Adventist architect, O. B. Jones, to build them a large home. By that time the Smiths had four children: (Uriah Wilton (1861-1937); Leon Alberti (1863-1958); Annie Arabelle (1868-1952); and Samuel Parker (b. 1872). They soon afterward added a fifth son, Charles Stevens (1874-1954) to their home. Uriah, who had a knack for coming up with new inventions, sold his patent for an inward folding seat school desk to pay for this home. According to Mark L. Bovee's notes, after the home was finished, O. B. Jones had lost \$3,000 on building the home for which Uriah reimburse him—something which speaks of the integrity of Uriah. Harriet used the 14 rooms in this home to add additional income to their family income and to provide affordable housing for students at Battle Creek College (founded in 1874 and on whose board Uriah served as chairman of the board for many years). The Smiths believed in education and saw that a ready supply of books was always available in their home (35 volumes are extant in this collection). Uriah and Harriet also took an interest in the lives of Adventist young people—informally adopting at least one student, Alma Wolcott (1860-1946). The Smith's also had a large family library (35 volumes are extant in this collection) for students to use. It is therefore no surprise that many of these students asked Uriah Smith to marry them (135 during his lifetime [see Box 3, Fld 50]).

The Smith family loved to travel. This collection contains pictures of a family vacation to Mackinac Island in northern Michigan, trips to early Adventist camp meetings from the early 1870s, and a special trip by Uriah and his oldest son Wilton to Europe, Israel, and Egypt. One of the largest collections of correspondence are letters from Uriah and Wilton back home to their family in Battle Creek, and still later published as trip reports in the *Review and Herald*.

A significant portion of this collection are items belonging to Annie A. Smith. Annie graduated from the Battle Creek high school in 1889, and afterward attended Battle Creek College where she graduated in 1897. It was behind their home that she fell in love with George W. Bovee, who lived directly behind their house. Annie and George were married in 1898 in the Smith home with her father, Uriah, officiating. Annie and George moved to a farm in nearby Bedford where they set up their own home.

The second major part of this collection are materials relating to Mark L. Bovee (1899-1990), the oldest son of George and Annie Bovee. Mark inherited his

grandfather's love for writing and at an early child put together handwritten storybooks with illustrations. He attended the successor to Battle Creek College, Emmanuel Missionary College where he graduate with a Bachelor Science degree in 1927, and the following year married a recent graduate (1926) from St. Helena Sanitarium, Eva Olena Nelson (1902-1977). Mark and Eva returned to Battle Creek where Mark work for Battle Creek newspapers as a linotype operator and Eva as a nurse in the Sanitarium. This period was only interrupted by a brief interlude from 1936 to 1938 when Mark worked as the College Press at Columbia Union College.

Mark became was an amateur Adventist historian who loved to collect stories about his family and other early Adventists. One of the most significant collections he acquired were items from the W. H. Littlejohn (1834-1916), which he was given from Litteljohn's adopted son, Fred Harvey (dates unknown) in the early 1930s. One of the most significant items is a chest belonging to J. N. Andrews (#000410) and two photograph albums (Boxes 17 & 18). One of Mark's lifelong dreams was to write a biography of his grandfather, which never materialized. Instead, it is through his many handwritten notebooks and more than 80 extant newspaper articles that one gets a glimpse of stories from the Smith family.

The Bovees were active in their local community. Mark served for several years during the 1950s and 1960s as communication secretary for the Battle Creek Tabernacle. As an active alumnus he gave of both his money and time to support Andrews University. Mark served on the alumni board and founded of the first regional alumni chapter of his alma mater. He also made sure his voice was heard in local circles writing many letters to prevent the Battle Creek Sanitarium building from being torn down and fundraising to purchase the White Home on Wood Street. He was an active Republican writing to his local congressman and even to the President of the United States, George H. W. Bush.

In 1977 Eva Bovee tragically died. Mark afterward married Esther Peterson who also passed away in 1984. After her death he remarried Ruth Chrsitiansen, but were later divorced. An only child, Ronald George was born to Mark and Eva in 1940, but he died shortly after birth. Mark Bovee died in 1990 and is buried in Niebul Cemetery in Friendship, Wisconsin.

Extant

Arrangement

The original arrangement was lost, and the collection is artificially ordered to reflect five categories: (1) original materials either by or to Uriah and Harriet Smith and their children (Boxes 1-3); (2) materials by or about Mark Bovee and his relatives (Box 4-11); (3) Audiovisual materials (Boxes 12-23); (4) Books (housed in the vault); and (5) Artifacts. The collection has been described at the item level with the exception of photographs from the Mark L. Bovee family (Boxes 21-23). Direct access to the photographs will eventually be achieved as photographs are digitized into the Center for

Adventist Research's photograph database.

Provenance

This collection was donated by Mark L. Bovee over a period of years beginning in 1964. The bulk of this collection was received by the Adventist Heritage Center in July 1987. Several other donors provided individual items: Leo R. Van Dolson who donated a land contract between O. B. Frisbie and U. Wilton Smith (Box 1, Fld 16), Mrs. Dorothy Smith Kewley who donated a copy of *Early Writings* given by Ellen White to Uriah Smith (Book #18).

These albums came from W. H. Littlejohn and given to Mark L. Bovee. The albums are bound in brown leather with gilded edges and metal clamps (8 ½ wide, 12 inches tall, and 2 inches thick). They were produced by the "Art Album Company" patented Nov. 25, 1879 (the second album carries two additional patents, July 5, 1881 & Nov. 29, 1881). They included 20 leaf pages with one to three slots per page for pictures. According to Jean Davis this company produced worked out of the relocated and renovated first Adventist church building. Some of the pictures from these albums have been removed, but are listed in an accompany folder of loose photographs.
