

As a youth, it was his dream to have a career in business and computer science, but during his undergraduate work at Spicer Memorial College, he felt compelled to change his major to theology.

Pastor Chawngthu comes from the Mizo tribe, who even into the late 1800's were head-hunters and spirit-worshippers. Now, Mizoram is one of the fastest-growing mission fields in the Southern Asia Division. Pastor Chawngthu is the first to earn a doctoral degree from among Mizo Adventists.
