Announcing Good News!



Why is it that only bad news is considered news? We also need to share good news! And our Seminary assessment office has told us to share some of that—the results of an annual assessment of the Doctor of Ministry program. So here goes...

Participants rated the depth and rigor of the program as high or very high (96% did so). The same response was received for the practical application of program learning, and they gave like numbers to faculty, knowledge gained, and developing their proficiency for service. Ninety-two percent said the program deepened knowledge and understanding of scripture, rating it 4 or 5 on a 5-point scale in that area.

I was very pleased that 86% said their spiritual life had grown as a result of the program, and their relationship with God the same number. Ninety-four percent said their commitment to ministry had improved, and 87% said they had developed new habits of

study that they expect to stay with them throughout their lifetime.

There were other neat areas of encouraging response to change as a result of the DMin program. We count it a privilege to serve you in a program that is changing lives!
