"Assessment" can mean more than one thing...

We use the word "assessment" in the DMin program to refer to the oral presentation of a DMin participant's doctoral project. However, the word is also used in a broader sense throughout academia to describe an evaluation process that results in improvements to the way we go about the learning process.

The Seminary has a full-time staff member whose responsibility includes formal assessment for all Seminary programs. DMin participants will receive email communication from AU Seminary Assessment (Denise Shaver) once every spring semester and once in the middle of a module year, asking participants to take a few minutes to respond via an online questionnaire. This is an opportunity for participants to tell us how that year's module helped them grow, and also an opportunity to suggest ways to help the program improve. Feedback is important and valued, so when you hear from Denise, be sure to respond!

...you need to have the MDiv degree or educational equivalent. If you do not have an MDiv degree, you need a ministry-related graduate degree, plus enough additional qualifying credits to equal a minimum of 72 U.S. semester credits.
