#### Allan Chichester Honored in Canada



Pastor Allan Chichester is a participant in the Urban Ministry cohort that started in 2011. The implementation of his DMin Project, "A Strategic Marketing Plan for Community Ministries at the Toronto West Seventh-day Adventist Church," impacted his community such that he was awarded the Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal by the Government of Canada. This was in recognition of the service he and his church members provided in the community of Etobicoke North in Toronto.

He was nominated for the medal by the Member of Parliament for Etobicoke North, Dr. Kirsty Duncan. Dr. Duncan conferred the recognition at a special award ceremony on November 13, 2012, at the Rexdale Community Hub. The resulting friendship that Pastor Chichester developed with Dr. Duncan opened the way for her to be invited as a guest presenter for his cohort's recent intensive in March when they met in Toronto. Dr. Duncan, an experienced and accomplished educator by profession, gave a dynamic and engaging presentation.

The 16-member cohort just completed the intensive portion of their fourth-year module. They have met in urban locations in Chicago and Toronto. Future cohorts may use other large urban locations in the U.S. and beyond.

## **Spring Semester Intensives for Current and New Cohorts**
