The Doctor of Ministry Missional Church concentration is designed to move participants into the mission field of North America through a current understanding of 21st-century mission praxis in western culture; the development of the spiritual life as the foundation for mission, leading transformation for mission and organic systems thinking, and transacting the vision of missional church through leadership development.

The teaching intensives for the first year will be January 26-February 12, 2015, at the Florida Conference office in Orlando.

- Establish a "dashboard" of critical indicators for missional church leadership.
- Utilize systems thinking to create a process model.
- Develop a team for biblical church leadership through organic discipleship as a foundation for developing leaders.
- Facilitate community transformation through collaboration and networking.
- Create a culture of inclusivity for missional practice.

Acting as the coordinator team and also serving among the lead teachers for the concentration are Dr. Michael F. Cauley, president of the Florida Conference, and Dr. Michael R. Cauley, pastor of the GracePoint Church and Exiles Missional Community in the Kentucky-Tennessee Conference.
