Chaplaincy



Consider the DMin Chaplaincy concentration where you will gain an understanding of chaplaincy within the context of organizational culture, systems thinking, and Adventist theology. Practical elements of the professional field will include spiritual leadership, consultation, networking, and ethical conduct. Course modules will address current issues and research related to the field of spirituality and health, and engage the discipline through sociological and psychological perspectives.

Discipleship



- Integrate the theological, theoretical, experiential and practical dimensions of discipleship into a theologically reflective practice of ministry.
- Train spiritually mature and relationally gifted people as spiritual mentors.
- Conduct a biblically and theologically faithful praxis of discipleship and biblical spirituality both individually and corporately.
- Discern truth from counterfeit as a means of both personal and corporate protection in light of the growing number of non-biblical "spiritualities."

Multiethnic/Multicultural Mission and Ministry



The all-new Multiethnic/Multicultural Mission and Ministry concentration is designed to develop visionary ministers and equip them with the competencies needed to lead ministries serving multicultural populations. Drs. Kenley Hall and Bruce Bauer will lead in discovery of best methods to develop effective models for working in a diverse community.

The application deadline for spring semester cohorts is January 31, 2018! First-year intensives will begin in April, 2018.

New cohorts are also scheduled to begin later in 2018 for these concentrations:

- Family Ministry
- <u>Discipleship (Spanish)</u>
- Intergenerational Ministry

Online Registration for DMin Participants

We encourage program participants to use Registration Central to enter your own course registration. This puts you in control of your own registration, keeps you in current student status without interruption in access to University status, and keeps student loans in deferred status. Remember, although the DMin program structure consists of year-long study modules, we have to fit within the University's semester structure. For this reason, registration must be renewed each semester, and not just in the semesters containing the intensive portion of your year's study. Registration is open now for the spring 2018 semester. See the <u>registration information page</u> on the DMin website for a thorough explanation and step-by-step instructions.

Nearing Your Program Time Limit?

Don't forget to plan ahead for an approved extension if you think you will need a bit more time beyond the six-year limit to complete your degree requirements. Application should be made before the end of your time limit. For an extension approval you will need all coursework completed (no DG grades), have your writing finished and approved for at least chapters 2 and 3 of your project, and written support from your advisor and second reader.
