Course Description

Provides reflection and experience in contemporary personal, public, and media evangelistic strategies as a basis for effective evangelistic leadership. Building on a biblical understanding of God's love for His lost creation, His desire to involve people in the plan of redemption and His unique empowering of each individual, this course will look at the elements necessary to help a church equip, develop, sustain and release God's people for evangelistic ministries. The course will cover the following areas:

1. Discovering a clear vision for mission based on God's unique calling.
2. Understanding God's purpose for your life.
3. Building and sustaining gift-based evangelistic ministry teams.
4. Networking for effective personal and public evangelism.
5. Factors and strategies for cell church growth.
6. The local church and media evangelism.

As a result of this class

You will

Experience development in five of the ten competencies of the Evangelism and Church Growth Concentration such as:

1. The ability to empower and develop the ministry of church members
2. The capacity to build ministry that reaches secular people.
3. Excellence in creating and implementing public evangelistic events.

4. Skillful use of media evangelism.
5. Small group theory and implementation.

Furthermore you will develop the motivation and understanding to:

1. Align the church's culture with God's vision and passion.
2. Build people and evangelistic ministry teams around their gifts.
3. Have a clear understanding of your spiritual gifts, your passions, temperament, preferred leadership profile, etc. and their impact in the context of team ministry.
4. Create personal and public self-sustaining ministries that multiply and are effective and relevant in reaching the community.
5. Be able to move your congregation to a discipling and growing cell church structure.
6. Create media opportunities and network for maximum evangelistic effectiveness.

Requirements

Pre-Intensive Assignments

Reading

Credit students must read a total of 3,000 pages for this class. The Required Reading totaling 1,086 pages should be finished before the first day of the intensive. A three-page analysis of each book read will be turned in during the intensive. Select additional books from the Recommended Reading list for the remaining 1,914 pages. A three page analysis of each book will be due at the same time as the Project Thesis. Include key insights that you discovered which would be useful in your ministry.

Note: It is against academic policy to claim credit for the same book in a different Doctor of Ministry module. If you have previously read any book on the list for credit, substitute another for it.

Intensive Assignments

Attendance

Students are required to be present for all class periods. The only exception is an emergency or sickness. Such absences will be excused provided written notice is given to the teacher on the day the student returns to class. Excused absences over 10% must have the dean's approval. All other absences are unexcused and will result in the final grade being docked and additional makeup work being required.

Project Thesis Due March 16, 2011	<p>A paper of at least 20 but no more than 30 pages will be required. This paper will become the chapter on methodology and strategy for your final project. Furthermore the paper should address the theological foundations and work done in the prior two modules of the program.</p> <p>The chapter on methodology and strategy is presented to your cohort group and revised with their assistance. When they feel it is ready, which should be prior to the due date, two copies should be submitted. One copy as partial fulfillment of the requirements for CHMN767 Formation of Evangelistic Strategy class and the other is to be returned to the student with comments.</p>		
Work Groups	<p>Students will participate in a minimum of two sessions of a “Work Group for input, critique, peer support, sharing of experience. A journal of those group meetings will be required from each student. Meetings should be 2 to 4 hours in length. Face to face meetings are preferred, but geographical considerations may necessitate telephone or online group meetings. The first meeting will be to present, review and suggest changes for the project thesis. This meeting should occur no later than December 15, 2008. The second meeting is to review the changes, other suggestions and final approval of the thesis by the group. This meeting should occur no later than February 16, 2009. Students are required to participate in both sessions. A report including attendance is to be submitted to the designated instructor by the group’s secretary.</p>
