WHAT IS IT?

The Family Ministry concentration prepares an individual for a proactive ministry of preaching, teaching, and working with groups to develop the positive family and relationship skills needed in today's culture. It is designed to promote pastoral excellence by attending to the pastor's personal life, the pastor's own family, families in the congregation, and the congregation as a family.

WHEN DOES IT BEGIN?

The teaching intensives for the first module will be July 13-August 1, 2014.

WHERE WILL THE INTENSIVES BE HELD?

All intensives for the Family Ministry concentration will take place at the Andrews University campus in Berrien Springs, Michigan.

HOW IS THE PROGRAM ORGANIZED?

Each of the year-long study modules includes a teaching intensive. During

the program you will also participate in regional work groups, develop a context support group, establish a mentoring relationship, read and reflect on the best literature in the field, as well as develop and evaluate a professional project within the context of your own congregation or leadership responsibilities.

OUTCOMES – WHAT WILL THE PROGRAM ENABLE YOU TO DO?

The DMin Family Ministry concentration develops competencies in four areas:

Family Life Education – Participants explore current issues and empirical findings related to family life education.

Spiritual, Theological, and Personal Development – Participants reflect theologically on the experience of families and seek to integrate their expanding spiritual and theological perspectives into their personal formation as individuals and members of families.

- Research and Praxis Based on current research, participants develop and deploy a relevant, field-based project intentionally addressing family ministry in the local context.
- **Professional Family Ministry** Participants gain knowledge of professional family ministry constructs and acquire skills pertinent to the practice of family life education and enrichment within the context of ministry.
