COURSE DESCRIPTION (proposed)

Participants receive assistance in forming their DMin project proposal, and orientation to issues in successful completion of the project. Participants review field and literature research techniques, writing standards, how to develop an effective work plan for completion of their project, as well as assistance with other project related topics.

COURSE OBJECTIVE

To assist students in the completion of an acceptable DMin project proposal, based on a relevant ministerial problem or challenge.

Write a one-sentence *Statement of the Task*. (Include in the Statement of the Ministry Challenge).

Write a one-page *Description of the Project Process* (The Research Method).

Complete the bibliography exercise (150 points). **Due Wednesday, October 17, 2007.**

Prepare and Submit a Project Proposal (450) **Due March 1, 2008.**
