What is transformational evangelism?

Transformational Evangelism is when the grace of God springs to life in the congregation and compels members to intentionally share that grace with their communities resulting in hope and wholeness for both. Transformational Evangelism will focus on: 1) renewing a culture of evangelism, 2) planting new churches in new ways, 3) advancing our mission in large, metropolitan areas, and 4) developing innovative approaches to evangelism.

What is the Doctor of Ministry project grant program?

This program grants awards of \$2500 from the North American Division to Andrews University Doctor of Ministry participants who successfully complete the implementation and assessment of projects that significantly contribute to the advancement and modeling of transformational evangelism. Projects in urban contexts are preferred.

How does the program work?

Applicants for the grant must be Doctor of Ministry students at Andrews University, apply in the first program year, provide their approved project proposal, and pass their assessment at the end of the DMin program. Applications will be processed by a small task group charged with that responsibility by the NAD. Applicants will be informed of the decision soon after application is made and receive the grant from the NAD soon after their assessment.
