GETTING STARTED

One of the most important things you will do before school starts is to get acquainted with our website which will be your key source of information, procedures, required courses, resources, schedules, important dates, and more. Ownership

We want you to take ownership of your progress here, and we encourage you to chart your MDiv experience right from the beginning. To this end, we have created the "Master Class Plan," which will help you to map out your MDiv sequence of classes for the next three years. Please seek academic advising only after you have mapped out your academic plan.

Registering for Classes

Your next step is to register for classes. The Seminary offers a vast number of courses, and to make this process less overwhelming, the MDiv program offers on-line support to advise you on the best route to take. To get started, contact your advisor and registration specialists at the following e-mail. if your last name starts with the letter:

who will advise you on which classes to take and walk you through the registration process. After you have been advised, and cleared, you will be able to register online from the comfort of your home.

Tracks

If your undergraduate degree was in Theology, you will be a **Track 1** student. This means that you will need to complete a total of 92 credits for the MDiv.

If your undergraduate degree was in a field other than Theology, you will be a **Track 2** student. As a Track 2 student, you will need to complete a total of 107 credits to finish the MDiv.

We will help you keep track of the courses you take through the use of a **check sheet**. A check sheet is a complete list of classes that highlights the progress achieved each semester and keeps track of the courses you still need to take.

Orientation

The start of the semester will be here before you know it, and you will soon be surrounded by classmates from every

corner of the world. Orientation for the newest MDiv class is scheduled in early May for those beginning in the summer, and mid-August if you are starting in the fall. At Orientation, you will receive a host of important information, tools, and inspiration, all needed for a strong start. For this reason, it is crucial that you be here, and attendance is actually a requirement. We also recommend that you arrive on campus at least one week before school starts in order to get settled in.


Emphasis

FINANCES

Costs and Financial Aid

Fortunately for you, the General Conference and the North American Division have greatly subsidized your education here. As a result, you will only pay about 25 percent of the actual cost. Tuition and the general fee do not include the cost of books, living expenses, health insurance, car insurance, and other expenses you may incur while being a student here.

That being said, we understand that this is still a significant cost for many of our students. To learn what options you have for funding your education, we encourage you to contact Student Financial Services. We have listed their number on the back of this booklet. They can also tell you whether you have been financially cleared to register for each semester.

Campus Jobs and Outside Sources of Funding

A number of students offset some costs of their education through campus jobs. There are opportunities for spouses to get campus jobs, too. The Office of Human Resources maintains a list of job openings in the area. Additionally, you can fill out an application at the Dean's Office for a

graduate assistantship here at the Seminary.

If you are an international student and you or your spouse is seeking work, you should contact International Student Services to learn about the specific guidelines that apply to you. We also encourage students to contact their local church, conference, union, or division to see if they can help with funding.

Your Spouse Can Study, Too!

A question we often get is whether spouses of seminarians can also study. Yes, they may. In fact, we enthusiastically encourage spouses to study alongside their seminarian husband or wife since your ministry is a joint one. Spouses of full-time, on-campus seminarians can pursue a Masters here at the Seminary at a deeply discounted rate. If this is of interest to you, contact the Dean's Office for more information.


