## Sheppardy

(Content Covered: Course Outline)

## Game Set Up

1. Choose one person to be the score keeper (Vanna).

- 2. Divide the class into different teams (each Quadrad can be a team).
- 3. Divide the questions into five different categories.
- 4. Arrange each of the five questions in each category from easiest to most difficult, with the easiest question being worth ten points, the next 20 points, the third 30 points, the fourth 40 points, and the fifth 50 points.
- 5. Put the names of each category on the board and the points below each category. (See example below)
- 6. Put the names of the teams on the board. (See example below)

### The Rules

- 1. The teacher serves as the moderator and judge.
- 2. Choose one person to be the score keeper (Vanna).
- 3. Select one of the teams to choose the first question (by random).
- 4. One team member will select a category and point value.
- 5. The moderator will read the question that goes with the category and point value.
- 6. Students must attempt an answer within ten seconds of the reading of the question.
- 7. Any student in the class may raise her/his hand if s/he wishes to attempt an answer.
- 8. The first hand to go up has the chance to answer first.
- 9. If a student raises his/her hand before the question is completely read, the moderator will stop reading and the student is obliged to answer the question with only the information that has been given up to that point.
- 10. If the question is answered correctly, the team will be awarded the number of points the question was worth.
- 11. If the question is answered incorrectly, the instructor will read the question again and restart the ten second requirement.
- 12. If the question is answered incorrectly, the team will lose ten points.
- 13. If a question is answered incorrectly, the team whose member gave the wrong answer may not attempt to answer that same question again.
- 14. If a question is answered incorrectly, the other teams may attempt to answer the question by the raising of the hands.
- 15. The person who answers correctly will be allowed to choose the next category and point value.
- 16. If no team answers correctly, the moderator will randomly choose a team which will select the next category and point value.

17. The team with the most points at the end of the round, or when time runs out, will be declared the winners.
