You should be proud of what your child did today for community service. As part of Andrews Academy educational program we did community service today, Thursday Sept. 24, 2009. As a school we feel that it is important for students to learn to serve our community. We teach this concept in a very practical way. We devote an entire day practicing this concept with the students, as well as having various smaller projects throughout the year.

This year the 11:10 am class was responsible for developing an activity to serve our community. For example the government class went to the Berrien Springs Courthouse Museum to help clean the grounds. One class went to Warren Dunes another class to St Joseph Public Library to help there. Others helped in the community services building, and various other places around Berrien County.

I wasn't able to get pictures of other sights so I'll share what happened with my class so you could get a sample of what happened today. By the students upbeat effort at this task they were treating it as an honor.



The second half of the morning my group went to the bridge in town. When the bridge was built a number of years ago Twixwood Nursery donated some shrubs and we planted them. Since then my classes have weeded, maintained the shrubs, and picked up garbage this side of the bridge just before you cross the river. It was impressive seeing so many teenagers working together to improve our town. There were some times to relax and have some fun as well.



In the afternoon we went to a retired couple's home to help them with yard work. This couple has served people for many years by being missionaries at various locations around the world for most of their life. I thought it would be good for the students as well as the retired couple for us to "serve" them for the afternoon.



Your children worked incredibly well and completed more than what we were planning for them. We cut up some firewood for their wood stove to heat their home, cleaned the siding of their home, cleaned the windows, and helped pick their apples. Your children worked so well we had a hard time keeping up with projects for them to do.



They also had some time to relax and have fun as well.
