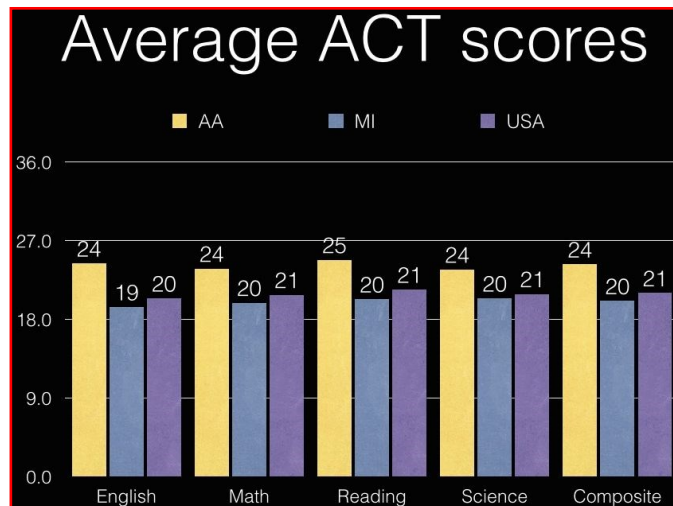

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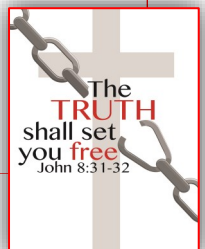
This past Monday was a redesigned and more extensive "Test Preparation Day" for the Freshmen through Juniors. Students learned insights and strategies for taking the standardized tests such as the PSAT, SAT and ACT.

Andrews Academy has a long history of academic excellence. You can see that the scores of last year's senior class are much better than the rest of Michigan and the national average. This has been true for many years. These ACT scores have been important for our students' entrance into many colleges and for earning scholarships. Last year's seniors received well over 1.64 million dollars in scholarships as a result of their ACT scores and GPA's.

Most years Andrews Academy has a few National Merit Finalists or semi-finalists. In 2012 AA had four national merit finalists in a class of sixty graduates. As we examined the data of fairly large cities in Michigan we noticed that entire cities may have one or two finalists. We are proud to say we have one semi-finalist this year. Congratulations to Jonathan Logan!

While a test preparation day like this past Monday is important, Andrews Academy provides ACT/SAT and PSAT preparation every day with a very rich academic program. Their varied learning experiences such as hands on problem solving labs, projects and other classroom activities daily build the knowledge base and skills to be successful with these tests.

Chapel Presenters

We have again been blessed by three presenters this week during chapel. Mr. Mario Ferguson, Nikolai Greaves, Pastor Carmona, and Jennifer Hernandez. Pastor Carmona told of a story when he was in a situation that was way over his head. While a student at Andrews University he was driving home to the east coast for the summer. He was driving an old car that in Ohio had a flat tire which put them late. Then late at night the muffler broke off. They stopped on the side of the turnpike and realized if they had safety wire they could tie it up for the rest of the trip. They had none and after a couple of hours a police stopped but was unable to help as he had to rush off. They were scared and began to pray. After about an hour a trucker on the other side of the turnpike in the darkness for some reason and stopped, came over to see if they were ok. They were so thankful that he for some reason had safety wire that retrieved from his truck. As they turned to thank him he and his truck were nowhere to be seen.

The group of AU students were convinced that an angel came that night to rescue them. Pastor Carmona shared Psalm 24:7 and concluded with two statements: 1. God is real, and 2. God still sends His angels to intervene when we are in over our heads.

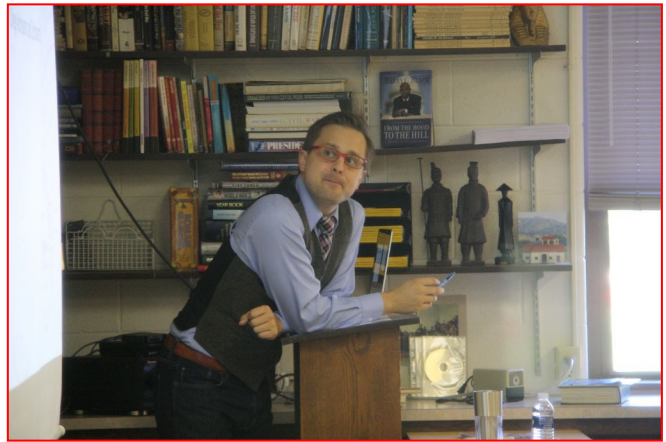


AA Highlights

This past Monday was a redesigned and more extensive "Test Preparation Day" for the Freshmen through Juniors while seniors were on their class trip. The students were divided into seven groups and participated in seven activities during the day. One station explained why there are these tests, another dealt with test taking strategies, and a third station introduced students to "Khan Academy's" online program to help students prepare for these tests. There were three stations dealing with subject strategies: math, science, and reading/writing. The seventh station, "recess" in the gym, provided physical exercise in the midst of a very busy academic day.
