Traditionally the Andrews Academy experience has been known for strong student leadership resulting from student participation in its curricular and co-curricular experiences. To help develop Christian leadership qualities of current student leaders, AA sent 15 student leaders to a leadership retreat at Camp Au Sable Oct. 1 - 4, 2015. The retreat, hosted by the Lake Union Conference, gave student leaders an opportunity to share ideas and experiences with leaders from all of the other Lake Union schools in a spiritually-charged environment.

The structure of the weekend includes a keynote speaker who focuses on several aspects of Christian leadership. Several of the breakout sessions give opportunities to meet with and glean ideas from students from the other schools who hold the same office. Additionally, each academy has time to talk and brainstorm ideas specific to their local situations. And, as with all good retreats, there is social and recreational time.

Above and beyond the organized program, Andrews Academy adds a few of their own activities to develop prayerful, thoughtful leadership. Leaders gather aboard the bus and pray that God will prepare their hearts and minds for the Holy Spirit's leading. Built into the schedule is opportunity for significant group sharing, which is used to give students time to commit to being used by the Lord as leaders, to make a stand as moral leaders, and to bond through prayer and singing. Additionally, a late Saturday evening group bonding activity caps the weekend.

Leadership Conference remains an invigorating and spiritually refreshing experience for AA leaders as they return home with a renewed commitment to their offices and their God.

## ASSIST

Andrews Academy participates in the **Academy Student Service Initiative Stipend for Tuition Program (ASSIST)**. This program is part of a nationwide project originating from Southern Adventist University. A major donor funded a grant to hire academy students to assist elderly adults in their community. Students participating in this grant-funded program perform light housecleaning and/or yard work, visit, read, and assist with many other responsibilities. These activities benefit the older adults with daily living and quality of life while also providing students an excellent opportunity to appreciate the value of service, relationships with the elderly and help with financing their Christian education. Andrews Academy students assist numerous individuals in the Berrien Springs community, most are located in the nearby Timberidge Retirement Center. The ASSIST program is being coordinated by Matthew Johnson.



## Chapel

This week Pastor Glassford, AA Bible teacher, presented a series of chapel talks on addictions. It was a dialog on how individuals may become addicted and ways to avoid addictions. The best way to not have addictions is to avoid addictions in the first place, to never start because once you do it is so hard to stop. When someone begins an addiction too often individuals experience the “slippery stop” of becoming more heavily involved.

He concluded the series by providing a summative list of avoidance strategies from a christian perspective: Surrender your life to God. Stay surrendered to God. Make sure your best friends are fight with God too. Be Content!!! And to remember Philippians 4:12, 13. “ I know what it is to be in need, and to know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation,.... I can do everything through Him who gives me strength.”
