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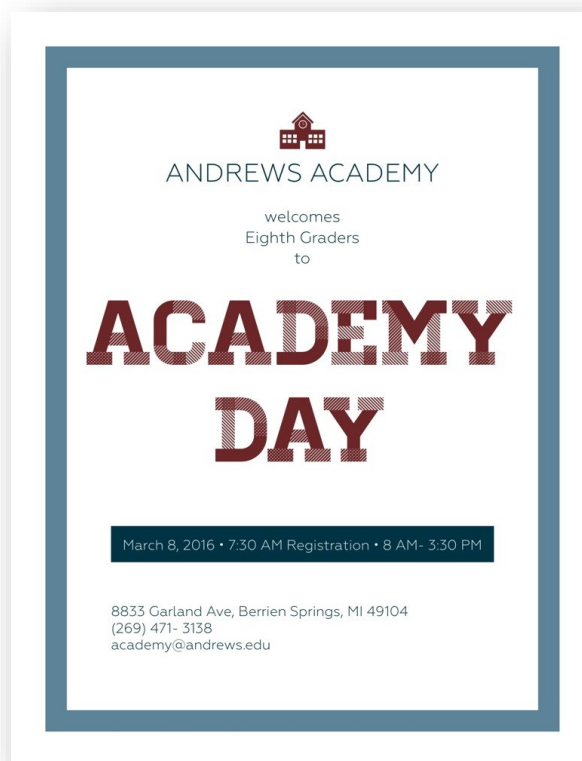

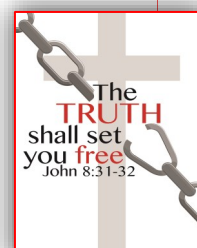

It is a small world after all. We often do not know how far reaching our influence may be. Please be praying that each student and faculty will be a shining light for Jesus.

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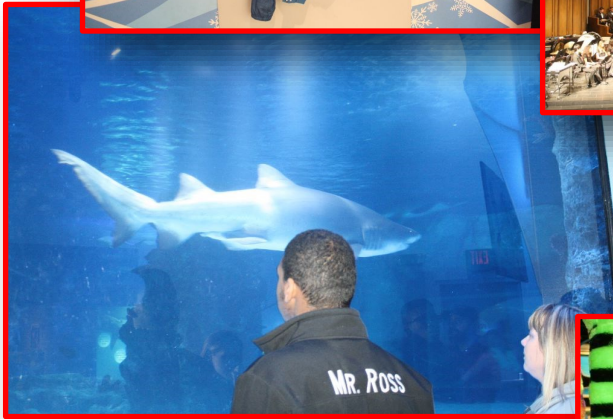

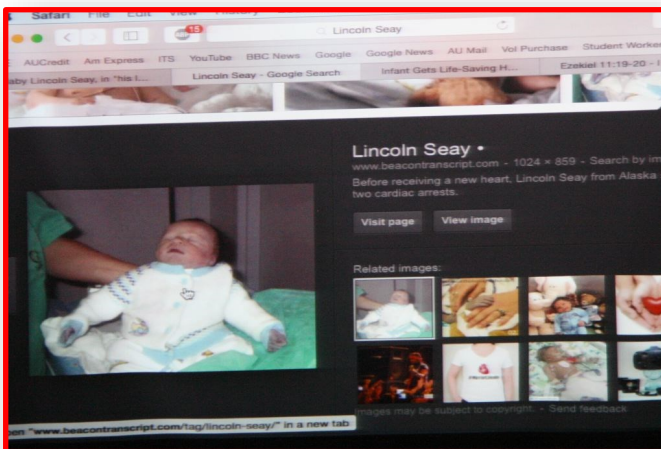

On Monday, Mr. Ferguson talked about the story from John 8 when a woman who was caught in adultery was brought to Jesus. She deserved to be killed according to the law of Moses, so the pharisees brought her to Jesus to be condemned. Instead of punishing her, he stooped down and wrote in the dirt until her captors went away. Afterwards he told her to 'go and sin no more.' Pastor Ferguson then used an illustration. He asked Mr. Sherman to come forward and offered him a \$10 bill. Mr. Sherman accepted it but before Mr. Ferguson gave it to him he crumpled it. He then asked Mr. Sherman if he still wanted it. Mr. Sherman said yes. Mr. Ferguson threw it on the ground and stomped on it. Mr. Sherman still wanted it because the value of the money didn't change even though it was crumpled and broken. In the same way, God still sees the value in us through all the brokenness and destruction.



On Tuesday, Pastor Glassford told us a story about a baby boy who was born with a rare disorder in which his all his organs were formed on the wrong side of his body. In days before he would have died, Lincoln received a heart transplant that saved him. Pastor Glassford read a note that the mother of Lincoln wrote to the mother of the child who lost the heart. She wrote about how she will always think of her and thank her every day. We too have been born with hearts on the wrong side, but through Jesus, we can get a new one and start a new life today.

Thank you freshmen for leading in singing this week. This is the first time the class of 2019 has led in singing.



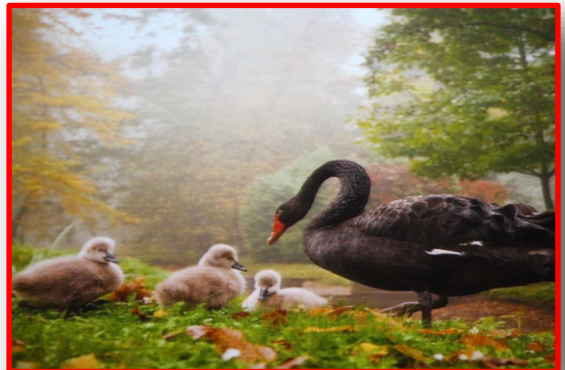

Pastor Glassford showed us a video of a horse trainer taming a wild horse on Wednesday by using gentle, calming activities and words that the horse wants to be tamed. He tied this in with the story from the day before of the boy whose heart had problems. When we give hearts to God, we expect a life free from sin. But usually sin finds us and we are disappointed because we don't like to feel wrong or stupid. In Matthew 5:5, Jesus says that the meek will inherit the Earth. We need to be meek and tame for God to be able to work in us. He is trying to 'tame' us like the horse trainer so that we can be even more useful in his work.



On Thursday, Pastor Glassford displayed some pictures of beautiful landscape and animals. He pointed out some interesting things, highlighting God's creative powers. 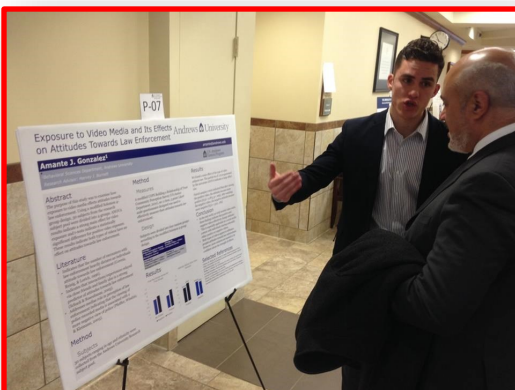
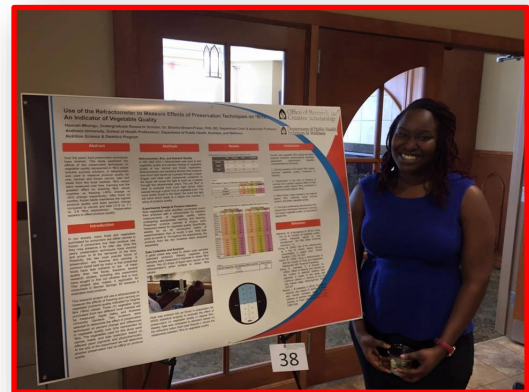
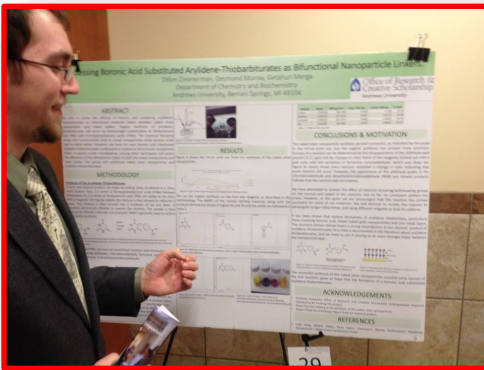

Nine members of Andrews Academy class of 2012 were presenting their research projects this past Friday at the Honors Scholars & Undergraduate Research Poster Symposium. Buller Hall, AU. It seems like yesterday they walked into the halls of AA and took their first science class learning about the steps of the scientific method.... now some are getting their research projects published in various journals! Seniors plan on getting involved in research as part of your College experience.

RE-ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2016-2017 OPENING SOON

As students look forward to summer vacation, we are already looking ahead and making plans for next school year. On March 22, current students will be receiving their re-enrollment packets. Students are invited to meet with their advisers to help create a schedule. We will be providing the assembly period on March 29 and April 5 for students to meet with their advisors as well. Besides filling out the paperwork in the packet, parents must go online to complete the Renweb re-enrollment.

Please go to www.renweb.com

- Select **Logins** from the menu bar and **ParentsWeb Login** from the drop-down menu.
- Type in your username and password. If you have forgotten your username or password, please click on the link provided.
- After logging in, click on the **Family Information** button in the left menu.

Click on the **Enrollment/Reenrollment** button.

Our Online Enrollment system will open with a link to the enrollment packet for your child. The online process should take approximately 15 minutes to complete. Your information will be saved if you need to quit and come back later.

The Instructions and Enrollment Checklist page of the enrollment packet may contain supplemental enrollment forms that also must be submitted. Further instructions on these forms are provided online.

Instructions for Creating a ParentsWeb Login (Only for Parents who have never logged into ParentsWeb.)

Please go to www.renweb.com.

- Select **Logins** from the menu bar and **ParentsWeb Login** from the drop-down menu.
- After the RenWeb ParentsWeb Login screen opens, please select **Create New ParentsWeb Account**.
- Enter **AN-MI** into the District Code field.
- Enter in the Email field your email address as provided in your application to the school.
- Click the **Create Account** button.
- You will receive an email from RenWeb Customer Support containing a link that will allow you to create your username and password. For security purposes the link will remain active for 6 hours.
- Please click on the link. A Change/Create Password screen will open. You may use the default username provided, or create a new username. Then type in your desired password into the Password field and Confirm Field.
- Click on the **Save Username and/or Password** button.
- Close the window.

Log into ParentsWeb as instructed above.
