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

### Chapel

On Monday, Nathan Buck shared his personal testimony of his spiritual journey as it related to his idol. He then shared Matthew 6:19-20, which tells us to store up treasures in Heaven because where our treasure is, there our heart is also. So what he spent his time on was what he treasured. He asked God to be a part in everything he did, including playing soccer. He doesn't regret this, it's made such a difference in his life and encouraged us to do the same. Before every presentation of this week of prayer we were asked a few questions to think about and discuss with our neighbors. The questions for today were: What's your favorite superhero? Why? What makes them so popular? Is there any connection between the Great Controversy and them?
