

## **Alumni and Friends of Andrews University**

It is my pleasure as an alumna of Andrews University, and its president, to let you know that the University remains strong and is doing well despite the turbulent environment of higher education! Let me share a few current highlights.

During fall 2022 we have just over 3,000 students studying through our Berrien Springs campus. It is particularly exciting this year to be fully back in person on our campus after the pandemic; the campus is full of energy and enthusiasm. While along with higher education in general we have continued to see a headcount drop (5 percent on our Berrien Springs campus), the student experience continues to be strong. We know that because of our steady strong retention (80 percent) and graduation rates (70 percent six-year graduation rate), both of which significantly exceed the average of our peer institutions. We also see comparative success amongst all our ethnic groups on the campus; that is important to us as we retain our very high rankings in both international and national diversity. We continue to educate many additional students internationally and through professional development classes in the College of Education & International Services. When these are all added together, during the academic year 2021-2022 the University taught in excess of 8,000 students.

Let me tell you a little about what is new this year and what is planned as we move forward. We were excited to receive a Lilly Endowment Grant of \$5 million for a new project in the Seminary that will significantly increase their capacity to engage with pastors and others wanting to create community presence and influence. We have other plans in place to further embed and spread the influence of our new innovation center. We officially opened our new career center with support

from another external grant. And we have some new programs that are in process of starting: BMus in music composition, BS in cybersecurity, PhD in business administration and Master of Health Administration. We anticipate that these will open new markets to us and look forward to the new academic depth they will bring.

Higher education is in a time of flux and change and Andrews will remain open to change and innovation as we address the new opportunities and challenges of Adventist higher education in the 2020s. What will not change though is our commitment to our mission: to our students, to our communities and to the church. In living out that mission we have embraced the branding statement "World Changers Made Here." We take that charge very seriously. Students come to us from around the globe, they study around the globe, and they graduate to serve around the world. We are committed to helping each student reach their potential and then commit to truly taking the best of what they have learned here to make a profound difference in the communities where they will live and work.

Meanwhile, alumni numbers continue to grow by around 600 students annually, whether from our main campus or from programs in Africa, Asia or Europe. Our alumni continue to positively influence their communities, their churches and

the wider world.

I hope that you, with me, will continue to be enthusiastic about Andrews University and its future. Please do pray for us and with us and continue to support us in whatever way you can.
