

Bruce Bauer, DMiss, is Professor of World Mission and Director of the Doctor of Missiology Program in the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University. Bruce received a MA in Religion from Andrews University in 1975, a MA in Missiology from Fuller Theological Seminary in 1981 and a DMiss. from Fuller in 1983. From 1989 until 1997 Bruce taught in the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University, then spent the next three and a half years as president of the Cambodia Adventist Mission. He returned to Andrews in January of 2001 and continues to teach in the Department of World Mission. Bruce is the editor of the Journal of Adventist Mission Studies.



Alberto Timm, PhD, is currently an Associate Director of the Ellen G. White Estate, Inc., Silver Spring, Maryland and a member of the Biblical Research Institute Committee. He has published extensively in Portuguese, English, and Spanish.



Andrew Tompkins, PhD candidate, worked for several years in India as a teacher, pastor, and trainer. He also worked as the Associate Director of the Center for South Asian Religions and taught at Spicer Memorial College. Currently he is working on completing his PhD with an emphasis on theology and mission as it relates to culture and religion.



Howard Weems, PhD, is currently director of the Ellen G. White Estate Research Center at Oakwook University. He has served as a Seventh-day Adventist minister and academician for over 32 years. His educational background consists of communications, theology, and psychology. After completing his Ph.D., he was invited to join the Psychology Department of Oakwood University in 2001 where he is now a tenured professor and administrator.
