Louise Geddes is a professor of English at Adelphi University. Her career as a dramaturg for off-Broadway's Rattlestick Theater is influential on her research on Shakespeare in performance, and she has published extensively about staging Shakespeare in such journals as Shakespeare Bulletin and *Medieval and Renaissance Drama in England*. Her first book, *Appropriating Shakespeare: A Cultural History of Pyramus and Thisbe,* tracks the stage history of *A Midsummer Night's Dream's* playlet from 17th century Germany to the contemporary stage. Her current research projects include the formal aesthetics of camp on the contemporary stage and a book-length project titled "How the Musical Became Meta."

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
