FAMINE RELIEF

Severe food shortages caused by drought have burdened southern Madagascar since 2018. COVID-19 has worsened the situation for those suffering and at risk of famine. The 20 Seventh-day Adventist churches in southern Madagascar made up of 495 families and over 1691 individuals, are facing severe crisis.

In response to the urgent need in southern Madagascar, the “Making a CHANGE in Madagascar” project is focused on raising funds to feed and sustain those impacted by the drought. A donation of \$75 can feed a family of four for one month. In addition to donations of staple items such as beans, rice, oil, salt, and hygiene products, we are working to help families build a sustainable source of income by supporting micro-enterprises in trade and farming.
