# Letter from Chair

Don't just choose a major...

### CHOOSE A MISSION!

Deciding on your major is an important part of university life and lots of students find themselves switching majors after a month or a semester or two. In fact, sometimes I've tongue-in-cheek asked freshmen, "What's your major this week?" - because choosing a major takes time. There are many important questions to consider:

- What are the job opportunities for a specific major?
- Is this major something I'd enjoy doing the rest of my life?
- Will I need to go to graduate school to become employable in this field?
- How can I make a difference in this world with this major?
- Does this major match my gifts, skills, personality, and passions?

But it is also important to look beyond the major and consider your mission. Your mission, your purpose in life, needs to guide all other decisions. God has called you to serve Him. There are so many paths of service for humankind. You've got to know your mission before you choose your major. So be sure to choose a major with a mission.

For students interested in "a life with a mission" the Department of Religion and Biblical Languages offers two main pathways:

- The Theology Major is the pathway of choice for those called into pastoral ministry. This major prepares graduates to work as pastors and meets all the requirements for entrance into the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary. This major prepares those who are planning to be pastors, campus chaplains or hospital chaplains, or Bible teachers. The theology major fully aligns with the new seminary M.Div. program.
- The Religion Major is primarily a dual-degree focus. This major is ideal for those who will seek employment through another major (such as business, music, dentistry, medicine) and who desire to become spiritually and theologically equipped for ministry as part of the laity. This ability to combine the religion major with another major offers many possibilities. For example, religion and social work are a very desirable arrangement. A religion major may also be a good choice for a transfer student or a non-traditional student heading into ministry. The religion major requires only about half as many credits as the Theology major and does not meet all of the Seminary entrance requirements. Students going to the seminary with a religion major would need to fulfill some additional pre-requisites. However, a large number of the pre-requisites can be met through this program. The religion major may be an excellent way to pursue your mission.

The Department of Religion also offers three minors: 1) Religion, 2) Biblical Languages and 3) Missions. The Religion and Biblical Languages minors provide rich, biblical scholarship. The Missions minor provides a pathway to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to our broken world.

# Academic Policies, Graduation Information, and Other Information

### **Bulletin Predominance**

This handbook is designed to supplement the bulletin. It is the responsibility of the student to review and understand the Andrews University Academic Bulletin. If any errors, vacancies, or other discrepancies are found, the bulletin has predominance.

# **Graduation Requirements**

- Minimum grade of "C-" for all major classes and cognates.
- Minimum overall GPA of 2.25 and major GPA of 2.50.
- Complete all required courses.
- Complete 30 upper-division semester credits.
- A minimum of 50% of credits must be done at Andrews University or 30 of the last 36 credits.
- A minimum of 1/3 of credits for a major and 3 credits for a minor must be earned on campus (both overall and for upper-division credits.)
- A maximum 25% of classes is allowed to overlap between majors and second majors or minors.
- Graduation application submitted. Please consult with the office of Academic Records to determine the due date for the application.

# Acceptance to Program

Students are not accepted into the Theology program until their second year in residence; this does not apply to transfer students. Students, please see your academic advisor, the department chair, or the department assistant for more information on this process.

# **Academic Probation**

Academic Probation is applied to a student when the cumulative Andrews University GPA falls below 2.0, the semester GPA falls below 1.75, or there is a combination of 3 or more withdraws, incompletes, or grades lower than a C in one semester. Students on academic probation will need to make an appointment with Student Success to set up an academic plan.

# Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary

Many students go on to earn the Master of Divinity degree at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary. Please consult the seminary in regards to their requirements, as some classes—particularly Biblical Literacy, Church Policy, and Biblical Languages—can be tested out of. Additionally, by completing

## Other Academic Policies

- Take the Math Placement test as soon as possible; students who do not achieve a passing score must register for remedial math courses as soon as possible.
- Transfer students and those changing their bulletin year should consult their advisors to determine the best way to finish their degrees.
- Students in the Religion Program should work with Mrs. Zork in regards to their practicum requirements, where they do 25 hours of service a semester with a report plus professional assembly requirements.


