The Michigan Department of Education is pleased to inform you that Andrews University's amendment to prepare teachers for English as a Second Language (NS) has been approved. This program may be offered as a minor for Elementary and Secondary teaching certificates.

The program is subject to continuing approval. As you are aware, the State Superintendent has identified a number of initiatives to reform educator preparation in Michigan. These initiatives include requiring national accreditation for all educator preparation institutions. All program re-approvals will be based on national accreditation decisions which rely on outcome measures selected to demonstrate the program has prepared well-qualified teachers. Your institution is encouraged to continue collecting outcome data, which is aligned with the educator preparation program standards approved by the State Board of Education for each specialty-area.

Congratulations on a successful review. The minor program changes being implemented to the NS endorsement program to 1) consolidate multiple overlapping courses [ENGL 435: Topics – The TESL Professional (1 SH), ENGL 435: Topics – Teaching & Learning for the TESL Classroom (1 SH), and ENGL 465: TESL Methods (2 SH)] into a single course [ENGL 456: Introduction to TESOL Theories, Methods, and Issues (4 SH)] and 2) offer a choice of courses for building candidate capacities in understanding the intersection of language and culture [ENGL 440: Language and Culture OR COMM 436: Intercultural Communication] – particularly germane to Standards 1.0 (Language, Linguistics, Comparisons) and 2.0 (Cultures, Literatures, Cross-Disciplinary Concepts) – are laudable for increasing the flexibility of Andrews' program pathways for candidates in a high need area.
