

THE ENGLISH-PROFICIENCY-TESTING-EXEMPT COUNTRIES

Undergraduate Students: Students who went to an English-medium* high school for a complete four years in these countries may be exempt from the Andrews English Proficiency requirement.

Graduate Students: Students who got an undergraduate degree from an English-medium* college or university in these countries may be exempt from the Andrews English Proficiency requirement.
