## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

### Academic Articulation between

# Oakland Community Collegeand

## **Andrews University**

Oakland Community College (OCC), a Michigan community college located in Oakland County, Michigan, and Andrews University (AU) located in Berrien Springs, Michigan, enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU or Agreement). The purpose of this Agreement is to provide students who have obtained an associate degree in nursing from OCC with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework towards the completion of a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at AU. The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be July 1, 2022.

HLC Assumed Practice (CRRT.B.10.020): The institution maintains a minimum requirement for general education for all of its undergraduate programs whether through a traditional practice of distributed curricula (15 semester credits for AAS degrees, 24 for AS or AA degrees, and 30 for bachelor's degrees) or through integrated, embedded, interdisciplinary, or other accepted models that demonstrate a minimum requirement equivalent to the distributed model. Any variation is explained and justified.

It is stated and agreed that:

# 1. The Program

AU offers a nursing completion program (the Program), which is a 12-to-24-month programdesigned for currently-licensed Registered Nurses who have passed the NCLEX-RN within twelve (12) months of applying for the Program. The Program allows such individuals to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree through part-time study over four to six semesters. The Program requires a total of 124 credits, with a minimum requirement of 32 credit hours through AU. The Program consists of coursework and practicum:

- a) Coursework. Coursework will consist of online courses. Students will take one tothree courses at a time.
- b) Practicum. Students will participate in two (2) practicum at a location approved by AU. Practicum experience will be preceptor-based, with oversight provided by AU Nursing Faculty.

Program degree and progression requirements are subject to change in accordance with changes in AU's program policies, as published annually in the Andrews University Bulletin.

### 2. Academic Transfer

Students participating under this Agreement may transfer applicable academic credit previously earned as part of their associate degree. All courses required to obtain an associate in nursing degree will be accepted for transfer credit, as well as all general education courses that comply with the Michigan Transfer Agreement (as shown on the official transcript). Other eligible transfer credits may be accepted for transfer as general electives, as permitted by AU's program policies. In all instances, the maximum number of transfer credits that can be accepted and applied toward degree completion is 92 credits.

#### 3. Admissions

To be admitted to AU under this Agreement, students must satisfy the regular AU admissions requirements as outlined in the AU Bulletin (http://bulletin.andrews.edu).

In addition, students must meet the program-specific admissions criteria required for acceptance into the RN-to-BSN program. These Program requirements are as follows: (1)an associate degree from an accredited nursing program; (2) an undergraduate GPA of 2.5 or greater; (3) a U.S.-issued Registered Nurse license; and (4) official transcript(s) from accredited colleges or universities. It is a prospective student's responsibility to discuss program-specific requirements with the department prior to application.

Advising of OCC students regarding admission and program requirements at AU will be the responsibility of OCC.

Each institution will monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this Agreement and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of students to AU.

# 4. Financial Arrangements

Institutional Obligations. There shall be no charges between OCC and AU arising from this Agreement.

Student Fees and Tuition. Each student is responsible for paying AU for all academic feesand tuition at the discounted rate of \$310.00 per course credit, plus the cost of required textbooks, and applicable distance education fees as required by AU.

## 5. Communication of Agreement

Both OCC and AU will communicate information about this Agreement to its students and prospective students. It is the expectation and desire of the parties to enroll at least 10 OCC graduates per cohort per year during the term of this Agreement. If this expectation is not meet, AU will have the right to terminate this Agreement at any time upon providing at least 120 days' prior written notice; provided, however, that any students then enrolled in the Program will be permitted to complete their degree under the terms of this Agreement.

Each party may provide on its website, a link to the partner institution's website.

# 6. Designated Articulation Liaison

OCC and AU shall each designate an Articulation Liaison who shall serve as the primarycontact between the institutions regarding this Agreement. The Liaisons may meet from time to discuss any aspects of this Agreement, including the parties' expectations concerning the number of OCC graduates enrolling into the Program.

## 7. Duration Of the Agreement

The initial term of this Agreement shall be a five-year period beginning from the EffectiveDate through July 31, 2027. This Agreement may be extended for additional five-year terms upon the written mutual agreement of both institutions. Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, by providing six (6) months' prior written notice from the President of either institution or by mutual consent; provided, however, that any students then enrolled in the Program will be permitted to complete their degree under theterms of this Agreement.

## 8. Entire Agreement

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the two institutions, and all prior discussions, agreements, and understanding related this to subject matter, whether verbal or in writing, are merged in this document. Each year AU releases an updated bulletin of its most recent courses and programs delivered through AU. The Bulletin is a document that should be referred to as needed. This MOU may be signed electronically and/or in counterpart, and each signature will be treated as an original signature.

#### 9. Indemnification

Statutory and common law theories and principles of indemnification, contribution, and equitable restitution shall govern and apply to claims, actions, causes of action, costs, expenses and losses (including attorneys' fees) resulting from or caused by the actions or omissions of the Parties or their respective employees and students pursuant to this Agreement.
