HONORARY DEGREE—MAY 2025

Paul Stewart Brantley

Candidate for Honorary Degree
Doctor of Pedagogy

Paul Stewart Brantley comes from a line of pioneers. His grandmother, Lottie C. Blake, MD, became Adventism's first Black physician in 1902. She was a protégé of Dr. John Harvey Kellogg and a friend of Ellen G. White. Brantley's educator parents, E.D. and Alice Brantley, touched countless lives in the U.S., Bermuda, Jamaica and South Africa. Following this rich legacy, Brantley has been privileged to serve as an educational pioneer on several fronts: higher education, health care and church administration.

Brantley holds a bachelor's degree from Atlantic Union College, master's degree from Andrews University and Doctor of Philosophy from The Ohio State University. His work in higher education began at Oakwood College (now Oakwood University), where he served from 1974 to 1985.

In 1985, he joined Andrews University's School of Education. In addition to serving as professor of education and chair of the Curriculum and Instruction Program, Brantley pioneered cohorts in Puerto Rico and Mexico, facilitated two Faculty Fellowships, and successfully chaired several doctoral dissertations. For these and other contributions, Andrews honored him with awards in research (1993), teaching (1999) and service (2001).

While at Andrews, Brantley served as founding editor of the Journal of Research on Christian Education (JRCE), the nation's first peer-reviewed journal on the topic that features scholarly articles from a wide variety of Christian traditions. He also helped establish Adventist education's largest website, the Curriculum & Instruction Resource Center Linking Educators (CIRCLE), which has now been incorporated within the North American Division's (NAD) Adventist Learning Community.

In the field of health care, Brantley's education work continued. In 2001, he became a member of senior leadership at Florida Hospital (now AdventHealth). He pioneered multi-campus leadership development and established computer learning for 16,000 staff members. In only four years, he organized a diversity office that was recognized by the Beacon Award as Central Florida's most outstanding diversity program among all industries.

In 2007, Brantley's "classroom" expanded exponentially when he took on the position of general field secretary for the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, where he organized and directed the Office of Assessment and Program Evaluation. Then, from 2010–2021, Brantley became a vice president for the North American Division. He directed the Office of Strategy and Research, promoting unified, mission-focused church organizations. Examples of his work include the creation of the NAD's "Hope and Wholeness" initiative and the General Conference's tagline "Reach the World" from 2015–2025.

For his ongoing commitment to improving educational resources and providing continued support for educators and students, Andrews University takes great pleasure in honoring Paul Stewart Brantley with the degree Doctor of Pedagogy, *honoris causa*.

HONORARY DEGREE—MAY 2025

Terry Shaw

Candidate for Honorary Degree Doctor of Business Administration

Terry Shaw, president and chief executive officer for AdventHealth, has been the leader of one of the largest faith-based health care systems in the U.S. for more than 40 years. In his current role, he provides system-wide administration for more than 52 hospital campuses across nine states and a robust network of pre- and post-acute care facilities across the enterprise. He leads a team of over 100,000 health care workers who provide compassionate care for nearly 9 million patients every year.

Shaw earned bachelor's degrees in accounting and computer science from Southern Adventist University as well as a master's degree in business administration from the University of Central Florida. He began his career with AdventHealth at what was previously Florida Hospital (now AdventHealth's Central Florida Division), holding numerous positions. Prior to becoming president and CEO, Shaw served as the organization's executive vice president, chief financial officer and chief operations officer.

Shaw has led AdventHealth through significant transitions and innovations, such as the formation of a singular, growing brand aligned around a commitment to whole-person care; a connected system of care that is easier for consumers to access and use; a future-looking financial stewardship and operational model that has positioned the organization for resilience; and the creation of a new division committed to a whole-person continuum of care for consumers. These and other achievements have supported AdventHealth's vision to become a leading faith-based, consumer-focused clinical care company that helps those it serves feel whole.

Throughout his four-decade tenure with AdventHealth, Shaw has played a pivotal role in defining the organization's vision and direction through his broad understanding of health care finance, information technology and overall operations. As a collaborator within the health care industry, Shaw currently serves as a member of the Healthcare Leadership Council, a policy think tank, and is chairman emeritus and current board advisory council member for Premier, Inc.'s board of directors. Starting in fall 2024, Shaw began serving as a co-chair for Health Evolution's Transforming Health Care Economics Roundtable.

Shaw is also active in health care collaboration and participates in AdventHealth's community involvement program. In 2024, he was honored as one of the 100 most influential people in health care for his impact and innovation in the field of health care. He is committed to nurturing the next generation of leaders in health care and has led many of AdventHealth's philanthropic initiatives in support of higher education.

For his continued support of the development of new leaders within Adventist health care and his dedication to whole-person health, Andrews University takes great pleasure in honoring Terry Shaw with the degree Doctor of Business Administration, *honoris causa*.

HONORARY DEGREE—MAY 2025

E. Edward Zinke

Candidate for Honorary Degree **Doctor of Divinity**

E. Edward Zinke, a theologian and businessman, is the son of missionary parents who served in Mexico. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in theology from Loma Linda University, Master of Arts in Old Testament and Master of Divinity from Andrews University, and doctoral candidate status in systematic theology at The Catholic University of America.

Zinke served as a pastor in the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference in 1967 before working at the Biblical Research Institute of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists from 1971–1986. Later, he was president and co-owner with his wife, L. Ann Christensen, of Ann's House of Nuts—an international supplier of packaged nuts, dried fruits and mixes—until 2008, when he and his wife sold the company.

From 1994–1996, Zinke served as co-founder and president of the Adventist Theological Society, where he presently serves as treasurer. During this time, he helped develop the publication *Perspective Digest*, where he continues as associate editor.

Throughout his career, Zinke has contributed regularly to the theological thinking of the worldwide Seventh-day Adventist Church in the area of creationism and has offered many significant lectures for scholars, theologians and church administrators.

Zinke has promoted a methodological and hermeneutical approach to education in which the Bible and its worldview are the foundational epistemological starting point. He, additionally, has fostered a collaboration between top Evangelical, Adventist and Jewish scholars on the composition of the *Pentateuch*.

Zinke is the author of several articles, essays and book chapters, as well as the “Adult Sabbath School Bible Study Guide” for the fourth quarter of 2024 and its accompanying book, “Themes in the Gospel of John.” He serves as senior advisor for the *Adventist Review*, editorial executive committee member of the *Journal of the Adventist Theological Society* and associate editor of the “Seventh-day Adventist International Bible Commentary.”

Over the years, Zinke has organized and financially supported numerous educational and theological conferences, symposia, and publications. He has generously donated to a variety of causes at churches and universities, including scholarship programs at Loma Linda University and Andrews University.

Zinke currently serves on the Board of Trustees at both Andrews University and Oakwood University, the Biblical Research Institute Committee, the Seminary Executive Committee, the Faith and Science Council, and the International Board of Ministerial and Theological Education. He is vice-chair of the Ellen G. White Estate Board and a member of the Missions, Inc. Board of the Adventist Laymen's Services & Industries.

For his ongoing support of theological dialogue, especially in areas of faith and science, and use of Scripture as the foundation of education, Andrews University takes great pleasure in honoring E. Edward Zinke with the degree Doctor of Divinity, *honoris causa*.

Academic Regalia

Andrews University adheres to the academic costume code for universities in the United States, initially drafted in 1885 and revised in 1932. A committee on Academic Costumes and Ceremonies, appointed by the American Council on Education, has, on different occasions, reviewed the costume and made several significant changes.

The gown for the associate degree is gray in color and styled the same as a bachelor's degree gown. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves. It is designed to be worn closed. The gown for the master's degree has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist. The gown is designed to be worn open or closed. The gown for the doctoral degree has bell-shaped sleeves. It is designed to be worn open or closed. These gowns are usually black, but the Andrews University doctoral gown is dark blue and trimmed in black velvet with the University seal on the left lapel near the top.

The length of the hood worn for the bachelor's degree, if one is used, is three feet; for the master's degree, three and one-half feet; and for the doctoral degree, four feet. The hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. The Andrews University hood is lined with dark blue and gold. Inasmuch as members of the Andrews University faculties hold degrees from a large number of colleges and universities, space does not permit identification of each.

Each scholar is expected to display the same pioneering spirit as John Nevins Andrews (1829–1883)—scholar, theologian, missionary and third president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists—who provided the name for this university and the ethos invigorating its mission. A statue of Andrews and his family stands just outside Pioneer Memorial Church.

Program Notes

The Processional

Regalia: A Grand Processional on DIADEMATA, by Kenneth Logan, professor of music, received its premiere presentations at the Andrews University spring 2001 commencements. University President Niels-Erik Andreasen commissioned *Regalia* in August 1999 for use in University commencements. Its title draws inspiration both from the traditional “regalia” garments of commencement services and from a hymn text associated with the hymn tune on which the composition is based. DIADEMATA is that grand melody graced by the regal words, “Crown Him with many crowns, The Lamb upon His throne; Hark! How the heavenly anthem drowns, All music but its own! ...” (*Seventh-day Adventist Hymnal*, No. 223).

Thus, on this ceremonial occasion, the organ processional evokes this surpassing context—the resplendent coronation of Jesus Christ—in which all earthly ceremony pales by comparison. In keeping with University tradition, *Regalia* provides distinct fanfares before the processionals of graduates, faculty and president’s party. In the remaining sections, the emphasis falls on transformations of the DIADEMATA melody.

STATEMENT OF MISSION
