Campus Update

Academy Selected Exemplary School

Andrews Academy is among 277 schools named by the Department of Education as the nation's finest. The school was one of 65 private and 212 public schools picked for national recognition in the annual "Schools of Excellence" program.

Andrews Academy is operated by Andrews University and has about 300 students in grades 9-12.

"We're very, very pleased," said Dr. R. T. Orrison, Andrews Academy principal. "The award shows we have developed an education program from a carefully designed philosophy and that has been carried out here."

The exemplary school designation is a complement to the "Nation at Risk" report on the quality of education in the United States. Former Secretary of Education Terrel Bell first developed a plan to recognize public schools, then created the Exemplary Private School Recognition Project.

Orrison said Andrews Academy received a Mail-O-Gram on June 21, 1985 notifying the school of the designation. A letter with further explanation and details of an award ceremony in Washington, D.C., in August will follow, it said.

When the school was nominated for the award in March, school officials said that in the past four years at Andrews

Academy some 89 percent of the school's graduates pursued a college education, fewer than one percent of the students dropped out and on any given day 97.5 percent of the students are in attendance.

Andrews Academy is one of two private and seven public schools in Michigan to receive the national recognition in 1985.

Andrews Academy and the other private schools were selected by the Council for American Private Education (CAPE) from 257 senior high schools. The private schools selected are in 27 states and Puerto Rico. CAPE received a Department of Education grant to carry out the program.

Schools are ranked based on 14 attributes of success and seven indicators of effective programs that include: clear academic goals, order and discipline, high expectations for students, student performance on standard achievement and minimum competency tests, attendance rates, awards won by students, number of students who go on to post-secondary school, enlist in the military or find employment.

Evaluators also consider opportunities for meaningful student responsibility and participation, rewards and incentives for teachers, positive school climate, well-articulated curriculum, and community support and involvement, announcements have said.

EDCO Makes Space Parts

The Electronic Design Company (EDCO), one of six Andrews Industries, recently built a computer numerical control (CNC) machine drill for Lockheed Missiles and Space Company. The CNC drill is used to make solar panels for the space shuttles, satellites and space stations.

The drill was custom built for Lockheed at a cost of \$75,000. Lockheed chose EDCO to build the special drill after one of their engineers saw the basic CNC drill at a machine tool trade show in California. When Lockheed realized that the EDCO drill was adaptable to meet their specific needs the sale was made, according to Terry Newmyer, vice president for marketing of Andrews Industries.

While the basic CNC drill takes approximately three weeks for EDCO to build from start to finish, the special Lockheed version required three months to build after three months redesign. In all, six EDCO employ-

ees worked on this project. When they finished Lockheed spent an additional \$15,000 to have the machine delivered to their Sunnyvale, Calif., plant by overnight airfreight on Flying Tiger Airlines, Newmyer said.

The machine, as designed and built for Lockheed, drills an 18 x 80 inch piece of Kapton flexible circuit board film in one operation. This film is then laminated to copper foil which forms the solar collector for the electricity generating panel. Because of the need for precision in this task the CNC drill is aligned using laser technology to guarantee the holes drilled are in exactly the right places, Newmyer said.

EDCO employed 18 Andrews University students this past school year as well as nine other full-time employees. Established nine years ago EDCO designs and builds electronic and computer controls. EDCO also manufactures and assembles circuit boards in addition to the CNC drill.

Integration of Computers on Campus

A fundraising effort that began in June 1983 has resulted in four major clusters of computers on campus. The goal is to have a computer in each academic department office at Andrews University, according to Albin Grohar, director of foundation research at Andrews.

The microcomputer clusters serve most curriculum areas. The largest cluster of 24 units, located in Bell Hall, is intended for general student use. A second cluster of 12 units in Netherly Hall serves the needs of business and liberal arts students. Engineering, technology and science majors have access to a smaller cluster in Haughey Hall, while students of the life sciences also have a cluster in Price Hall. This distribution of computers makes one accessible to every student on campus without the long wait that discouraged computer use in the past.

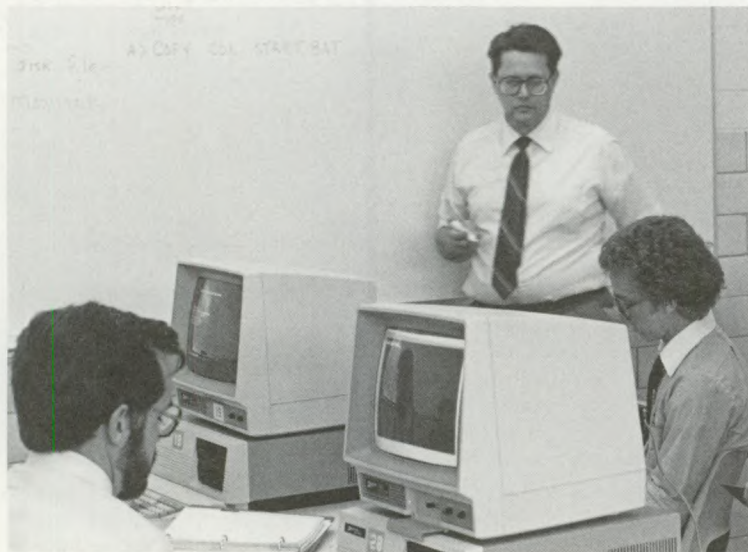
The university feels this has come about in a large part due to the leadership efforts of Whirlpool and Zenith and their interest in education in Berrien County, Grohar said. These corporations believe education strengthens the community and therefore provided challenge grants and donations that enabled the university to solicit additional support from other private contributors. In the two

years since the project began some \$250,000 has been raised toward this project.

According to Grohar the next step in the project is to raise an additional \$50,000 for more software and printers. The software is needed to help faculty members implement computer technology in their classes. Obvious uses include instruction, evaluation and enrichment of course offerings. Additional printers are needed to reduce the waiting time involved in having more than one computer to a printer when printouts are needed.

Students at Andrews will benefit from this computer availability in a number of ways, according to Lawrence Turner, chairman of the information and computer science department. Foremost is the marketable skill of being computer literate. This will be a definite must in job searches by college graduates, he feels. In addition, they will have the advantage of learning specific applications of computers in their major field of study.

"Since society is now as dependent upon computers as it is on electricity, cars, telephones and the other amenities of 20th century life in America, the university provides students the necessary skills to serve society efficiently by giving them opportunities to learn these skills before they graduate," Turner concluded.

The Dowagiac Roadrunners, one of the largest jogging clubs in Michigan, was hosted on campus in April by Fireside Fellowship, according to Liz Beck, coordinator of the Andrews Fireside Fellowship.

After an hour-long run the joggers were welcomed by Dr. W. Richard Leshner, president of Andrews, at a vegetarian meal prepared in their honor. During the meal lectures were given on health and fitness by Mrs. Charlotte Hamlin, assistant professor of nursing at Andrews and 10 medal winner at the 1984 Illinois Senior Olympics held in Springfield, and Dr. John Duge, cardiologist and associate professor of church ministry in the Andrews Theological Seminary, Mrs. Beck said.

Directed by Ron Gunn, dean of sports education at Southwestern Michigan College, Dowagiac, Mich., the more than 70 member class has run mara-

thons in New York, Chicago and Honolulu. They have been featured in Runner and Running Times magazines, the Chicago Tribune and Detroit Free Press.

Charlie Gratz, a member of the jogging club, and his youth at the Dowagiac Methodist Church, became acquainted with the Andrews Fireside Fellowship when the two groups met for joint activities. Through this association, the Dowagiac Roadrunners were invited to Andrews by members of Fireside Fellowship.

Mrs. Beck began Fireside Fellowship in 1977. Her goal was to give Andrews students an informal and unstructured atmosphere in which to fellowship, worship and to coordinate events with other organizations in the community.

According to Mrs. Beck, the Monday Night Jogging Class presented the Andrews Fireside Fellowship with a gift of \$250 in appreciation of the meal and program.

Scholarship Money From Local Realtors

The Executive Committee also appointed Lyle Botimer associate vice president for admissions and marketing. Botimer



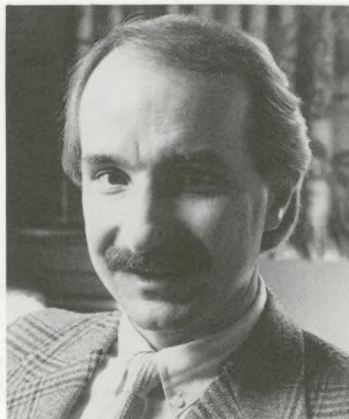

Andrews Wind Ensemble Tours European Cities

Andrews University's Wind Ensemble, with Barbara Favorito, conductor, brought sacred and secular music to selected European cities during their summer concert tour June 4 to 18, 1985.

The tour schedule included concerts at the Adventist Seminar Marienhoehe in Darmstadt, West Germany; the Seminaire Adventiste du Saleve in Colonges-sous-Saleve, France; the Advent Mission Church in Salzburg, Austria; the Advent Jugend in Augsburg, West Germany; Newbold College in Bracknell, Berkshire, England; the London Central Adventist Church, the Holloway Seventh-day Adventist Church in London, England; and the Gospel Facility Hall in Amsterdam, Netherlands.

"Our goal was to serve as Christian ambassadors for Andrews University and the church. It was the most important reason for the tour," said Favorito. "The Wind Ensemble members learned to live and work together with this goal in mind."

The 40-member ensemble laid plans for the tour two years ago and the spirit was "we all go or none of us go," referring to the financial arrangements. So the group raised money by selling stationery, candy and pillows, holding a jog-a-thon, decorating and delivering Valentine message cookies, collecting offerings at their concerts and asking businesses and professionals for sponsorships.

Although the concerts were held in both Adventist and non-Adventist communities, the concerts provided a boost particularly to the European Adventists, according to Miss Favorito. "Many people said this was their first personal encounter with Andrews. Because of its worldwide scope, many European Adventists identify with Andrews as one of 'their' schools. Now Andrews has become a 'face' to these people—the face of a smiling, loving, Christian young person."

An ambitious concert schedule allowed for little more than

sightseeing from the bus while traveling to the next concert site. But the Wind Ensemble members did get a sampling of special European sights. They visited the cathedral in Koln, Germany, St. Pierre in Geneva, Switzerland and St. Paul's in London. The Reformation Wall, Hitler's Eagles Nest, the concentration camp at Dachau, the changing of the guard at Buckingham Palace, a boat ride on the canals of Amsterdam and a visit to Anne Frank's home, plus some shopping time, provided tour members with sparkling memories and a first-hand cross-culture education.



"Without a doubt we got as much as we gave. To watch and experience the caring, consideration and Christian love among the Wind Ensemble members will always be one of the highlights of my career. The students lived what Christian education is all about," Miss Favorito concluded.

U.S. Representative Visits Campus

"America is at a crossroads in education," said U.S. Representative Mark Siljander to the students and faculty of Andrews. "Parents are demanding a better quality of education for their children. Strong leadership is needed in government to set the course."

Siljander spoke at a graduate student colloquium on the topic "Current Status of Education in the United States." He addressed the on-going social problems of America that he says are discouraging youth today. "The problems are im-

mense, but they are not insurmountable," he said.

According to Siljander, quality education for America's youth helps to make the difference between a future of hope or a future of destruction.

Siljander is Fourth District Congressional Representative for the State of Michigan. Previously he served four years in township government and was elected three times to the Michigan House of Representatives.

The graduate student colloquium is a program of the Andrews School of Education. According to Dr. Bernard Lall, professor of educational administration and chairman of the graduate colloquium, the purpose of the program is to offer graduate students the opportunity to meet with leaders in education, industry and government.

Whirlpool Donates Appliances

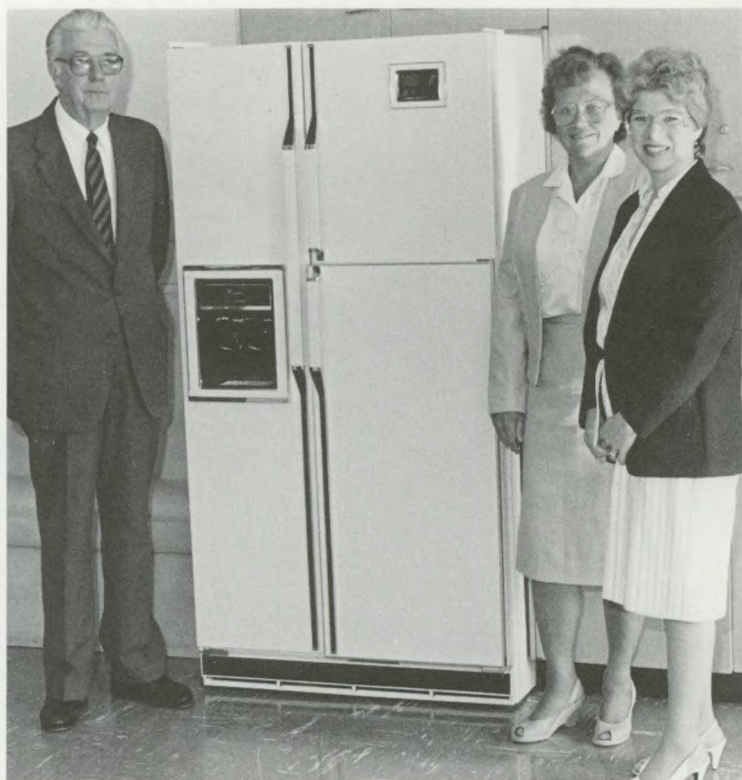
The Whirlpool Corporation of Benton Harbor has presented

Warren Participates In Freedoms Foundation Seminar

■ **Dr. J. Wyrick Warren**, assistant professor of English at Andrews University, was one of 70 people selected to attend a faculty development seminar titled "United States Foreign Policy," in June. This seminar, and Warren's fellowship to attend it, was sponsored by the nationally known Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge in Pennsylvania.

The purpose of the Freedoms Foundation is to carry on national programs of information and education to emphasize the unique freedoms of U.S. citizens under our constitutional form of government. These programs promote traditional values and provide better understanding of responsibilities of citizenship.

"As a faculty member of an education institution which operates on a world-wide scale, I was pleased for the opportunity to attend the seminar," said Dr. Warren. "My participation gave me valuable understandings of how Andrews University can better effect its national and international missions."

Dr. Warren has been on the Andrews faculty since 1976. He has a master of arts degree in English from Ohio State University in Columbus and a doctor of philosophy degree also from Ohio State.

He is a member of the National Council of Teachers of English, the Adventist Forum of English Teachers and was nominated for Who's Who in Black America in 1980.

Smith Sights 701st Bird Species

■ **C. Roy Smith**, a birdwatcher for nearly 40 years, recently returned from a trip where he spotted his 701st bird. It is the work of a lifetime, according to Smith, a biology teacher at Andrews Academy.

Smith left for the Alaskan island of Attu, westernmost island of the Aleutian chain in the Pacific Ocean, on May 17. He returned home to Berrien Springs June 10 having added several species to his sightings list.

When he left for Attu only 29 people in the United States had reached the 700-plus plateau. On the charter tour of which he was a part, two other birders also topped the 700 mark, according to Smith.

To reach the 700 mark an avid birder has to travel to virtually every state and several of the Canadian provinces, he added. The sightings made on Attu allowed Smith to add to his list several Asiatic species that had been blown off course during their migrations and ended up on Attu. Other birds on his list include South and Central American species he sighted while in the southwestern portions of the country.

Smith has been a biology teacher at Andrews Academy since 1961. He received a master of science degree in biology from the University of Michigan and has taught in the Adventist school system in Massachusetts and Illinois before coming to Andrews. He is a member of the National Association of Biology Teachers, the American Ornithologists Union, the Wilson Ornithological Society, the Cooper Ornithological Society and the American Birding Association.

Seminary Student Receives Bible Society Award

■ **Daegeuk Nam**, a student at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University, won one of the national awards for excellence in biblical studies presented annually by the American Bible Society (ABS).

ABS presents these awards annually to students in seminaries and colleges across the United States in gratitude for the work these institutions are doing to prepare students for Christian ministry. Each school selects the particular individual to be honored from its own student body. For more than 169 years ABS has had as its single task the translation, publication and distribution of the Holy Scriptures throughout the world without doctrinal comment or note.

Nam received an ABS Greek-English New Testament with the ancient Greek and the Today's English Version texts in parallel columns. The award was presented at the seminary chapel service in June by Dr. Gerhard Hasel, dean of the seminary.

Nam, whose home is Seoul, Korea, is studying toward a doctor of theology degree in biblical studies. He came to the seminary with his wife and three sons a year and a half ago. Prior to coming to the seminary he taught German and theology at Korean Union College in Seoul, where he also served as academic dean. He plans to return to Korean Union College after completing his doctoral degree.

Becker Named Honored Alumnus for Walla Walla

■ **Dr. C. Warren Becker**, professor of organ at Andrews University, was named an honored alumnus of Walla Walla College during the 1985 Walla Walla Alumni Homecoming Weekend

held April 18 to 21. Becker received the honor for his remarkable accomplishments in the field of music education, his long teaching career and Christian influence on students.

Dr. Becker received a bachelor of arts degree in music from Walla Walla College in 1945 and followed this with a master of music degree from the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N.Y. in 1951. He completed a doctor of musical arts degree in organ performance and pedagogy in 1963, also from the Eastman School of Music.

From 1979 to 1981 Dr. Becker took a leave of absence from teaching to complete a revision and expansion of the five-volume series, "Music Literature Outlines." He co-authored this series with the late Harold Gleason, renowned organist and former professor at the Eastman School of Music. Dr. Becker considers his work on "Music Literature Outlines" as one of his most personally satisfying accomplishments.

Prior to coming to Andrews in 1959, Dr. Becker was associate professor of music and chairman of the music department at Pacific Union College. In 1970 he was chosen for the Teacher of the Year award at Andrews. Also, in 1973 he was honored with the presentation of the John Nevins Andrews Medallion for outstanding contributions to the profession of teaching.

Rilla Taylor in Nurses Hall of Fame

■ **Dr. Rilla Taylor**, professor of nursing at Andrews University, was inducted into the Associa-

tion of Seventh-day Adventist Nurses' (ASDAN) Hall of Fame at the national ASDAN conference held at Cohutta Springs, Ga., in April.

Dr. Taylor is the 31st person to be inducted into the ASDAN Hall of Fame, which is the highest honor given by ASDAN to one of its members. Dr. Taylor was awarded induction into the Hall of Fame for her contributions to the progress of Seventh-day Adventist nursing, her leadership in professional associations and community affairs, and her contribution to nursing through research, writing and public addresses.

She received a bachelor of science degree in nursing education from Columbia Union College in 1958. She earned a master of science degree from the University of Oregon and a doctoral degree in educational administration from Andrews in 1980.

Dr. Taylor has taught nursing at Hinsdale Hospital, Hinsdale, Ill., at Kanye Hospital, Botswana, Africa, from 1960 to 1975, and at Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware. She joined the Andrews faculty in 1979 and has chaired the department of nursing since 1981.

Presently Dr. Taylor is writing a manuscript titled "Christian Concepts: Core of Professional Nursing Practice." The book addresses the relationship of the Three Angels Message to the practice of nursing. It is on this and other related topics that Dr. Taylor gives seminars to ASDAN chapters throughout the United States.

Edith Davis Receives Awards

■ **Edith C. Davis**, assistant professor of education, emeritus, was the recipient of two awards during graduation ceremonies at Andrews Academy. A Moving Moment

For the audience, the moment was more moving than the central figure thought it should be. Name after name had been read, graduate after graduate had walked solemnly across the Pioneer Memorial Church platform to receive the presidential handshake and the shiny black vinyl folder. It takes a long time to give out more than 500 diplomas one by one and the audience had settled into the routine. Nothing broke the solemn ritual save the rare and tentative smattering of applause from excited relatives who could not restrain the urge to clap for their special one.

But then there was a slight pause, and Richard Schwarz looked down into the aisle in front of him. He read another name. The audience waited. No one strode across the platform. Instead, four graduating seminarians stepped up from their seats in the front row and lifted a wheelchair-bound graduate to the stage. The audience stirred, hundreds straining to see what was happening. There were extra smiles and special words of congratulation from Richard Leshar as he bent down, shook hands and presented a diploma to Sarita Yvonne (Cantrell) Mayhawk.

For Sarita, there was nothing unusual about the moment beyond the special joy of graduating. But the audience did not agree and broke into a spontaneous and sustained ovation in recognition of her achievement.

Sarita has been handicapped since birth with a moderately severe case of cerebral palsy, and has learned, with poise and grace, to deal with substantially impaired speech and motor control. She attended Adventist schools all her life, completing grades one through nine at Davison Junior Academy in Detroit, grades 10-12 at Andrews Academy, and five years of college at Andrews University, leading to her bachelor of arts in business administration. She took the law school admission test last March and will apply this year to Notre Dame Law School, which she hopes to enter in the fall of 1986.

When she finishes, she intends to specialize in civil legislation for the handicapped.

And what did Sarita Mayhawk think of the special treatment, the unusual attention, the spontaneous and warm ovation in a service often noted for its funereal solemnity? She was pleased and yet, understandably, she was just a little embarrassed. It is not always easy to live in a society that, however well meaning, may not yet fully understand and accept the handicapped into the world of everyday life. She says, "Most people have a certain idea of a person in a wheelchair or with a handicap like cerebral palsy. Society doesn't expect them to be normal and to do normal things like getting a college degree. They assume it's out of the ordinary. I think that's why they (the audience) responded the way they did."

Sarita stops short of offering an opinion about whether the special recognition was appropriate. It was, after all, a heartfelt and sincere tribute from a great assembly that strives to be known as a caring community. And had Sarita been able to see more clearly through her tear-filled eyes, she would have seen many other eyes in that congregation just as glistening as her own.

Spring Commencement

Andrews graduated 495 students from the six schools of the university on June 2. The commencement address was by Milton J. Murray, director, Philanthropic Service for Institutions, the fundraising consultant service department of the General Conference.

Murray was also one of two recipients of honorary doctorate degrees. He received an honorary doctor of laws.

Among Murray's recent outstanding achievements has been the establishment of the Business Executives Challenge to Alumni (BECA) program which in four years has more than tripled annual alumni giving to Adventist colleges. It is estimated that during his career, Murray has been instrumental in raising nearly \$50 million.

Charles J. Nagele, retired president of Harris Pine Mills, Portland, Ore., also received an honorary degree, a doctor of business administration.

During Nagele's career at Harris Pine Mills, a furniture manufacturing company, 23 plants were established at school centers around the United States. These profitable industries provide gainful employment for thousands of students in Adventist schools each year.

Arlene Friestad, then dean of women at Andrews, was a recipient of the J. N. Andrews Medallion. The medallion is awarded by the university in recognition of superior achieve-

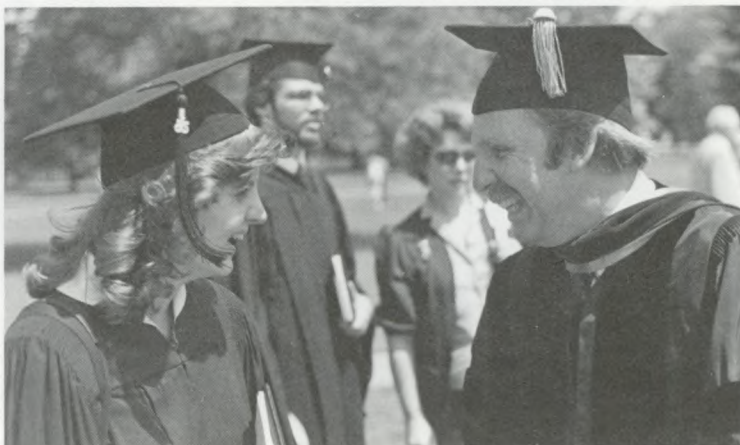
ment in the advancement of knowledge, and outstanding contributions to the cause of Seventh-day Adventist education.

In conferring the medallion to Miss Friestad, Dr. Leshar said, "Her service to the Seventh-day Adventist church has spanned 39 years—38 of them on the campus of this institution. Her remarkable accomplishments in her profession have unquestionably had a most profound influence on the Christian character of this institution and on thousands of graduates who now serve around the world."

In his address to the graduates Murray said, "My intent this commencement is to draw your attention specifically to a quartet of qualities . . . and their significance as these qualities bear on what we hope to accomplish in our various callings. I commend to you these four virtues: Courage—courage to lead, courage to follow, courage to act, courage to fail with grace, courage to speak up for good, courage to speak against evil, courage to love the unlovable, courage to face ourselves as we are, courage to live the Christ-like life whatever the circumstance.

"The second quality is Idealism. Most of us tend to be enthusiastic idealists but neglect to apply equal energy in striving to achieve our ideals," Murray continued. "Idealists are in demand—that is, those who discern clearly not what is expedient but what is high-minded.

"Our third quality is Patience.

Even now, in your youth, develop the art of patience vital for purposes of judgment, consideration, kindness, farsightedness.

"The fourth quality is Realism. Accept early on the calm approach of realism as a necessity of life and as an act of grace for yourself and for those who associate and work with you."

Of the 495 graduates, 13 received doctoral degrees, 192

received master's degrees, 227 received bachelor's degrees and 63 received associate degrees. By schools, 94 graduated from the Theological Seminary, 55 graduated from the School of Graduate Studies, 52 from the School of Education, 59 from the School of Business, 68 from the College of Technology, and 167 from the College of Arts and Sciences.

Fifty-three students graduated in absentia from five schools affiliated with Andrews in other countries. Those five schools are the Adventist Seminary of West Africa in Nigeria, Avondale College in Australia, Montemorelos University in Mexico, Helderberg College in South Africa and Newbold College in England.

Commencement ceremonies were the conclusion to a week-end of events honoring the graduates. Sabbath morning Glenn A. Aufderhar, president of the Michigan Conference, gave the baccalaureate address. On Friday evening the consecration sermon was given by Dr. G. Elaine Giddings, professor of communication, emeritus, at Andrews.

A tribute to teachers

Editor's Note: The following tribute to teachers was given at the Sabbath evening vesper service of June commencement weekend. It was written by Lynn Caldwell, who graduated with a bachelor's degree in public relations and has since secured her first job as a public relations assistant at Medical Center Hospital, Punta Gorda, Florida.

When she learned we wanted to print her tribute to teachers here, she said, "Well, whatever you do in editing it, just make sure that you raise Andrews' banner high. I have decided that if I ever get lots of things published, and become a famous writer, I will always insist on a byline that reads: 'Lynn Caldwell is a graduate of Andrews University.'"

I remember freshman registration. Had they given out an award that day for the freshman most likely to get discouraged the fastest, I am sure I would have won. Within minutes I had crumbled in a discouraged heap at the English department table. The English professor sitting across from me, who was well past retirement age, reached across the table, firmly grasped my hand and said, "Don't you get discouraged, don't you dare! Registration is always hard the first time. Now you wait right here." With that she grabbed my papers and, while I watched in amazement, she got me smoothly over a major hurdle in the registration process. It was through experiences such as this one and many others during my freshman year, that I began what I call my list of heroes. And I would imagine that the graduates in the class of 1985 have their own lists of heroes, also. They are lists of faculty and staff that we have known throughout our college careers that have touched our lives in a large and small, but always very special ways.

My list, among others, includes a journalism professor who not only tells the best Norwegian jokes I ever heard, but who never forgot to remind his stu-

dents that his office door was always open if we ever needed to talk. Also upon my list is a lady, once my boss and a member of the Andrews staff, who carries herself with such Christian dignity and professional sincerity that I cannot help but admire her. Through her I wish to say a special thanks to the staff of this campus. You are teachers in a very practical sense of the word.

As we the graduates look at the heroes upon our lists we ask: "What is it about them that attracts us to them so?" Maybe we can find the answer by looking at what is so unique and memorable about you. You are brilliant. And as your students we take pride in your brilliance. We may not remember every lecture you gave, but we will remember the times you knelt by your lectern and prayed in our behalf. Editor's note: The following is Andrews President Richard Leshner's General Conference Session report on university progress. This report appeared in the July 2, 1985 issue of the Adventist Review, one of the special daily bulletins of the General Conference Session.

Andrews University: A Five-year Report, 1980-1985

The past quinquennium has been a time of growth, uncertainty, stress and outstanding progress for Andrews University. During these years of struggle for all institutions of higher learning, Andrews has achieved milestone advances on many fronts and seen clear evidence of God's leading through changing times.

Since the last General Conference Session, two new professional schools have been organized within the university structure. The School of Business was established in 1980 to give a higher professional profile to those undergraduate and graduate programs that train business leaders for the church and its institutions. For similar reasons, and to improve administrative efficiency, the School of Education was established in 1982. At the same time, the university received accreditation approval to offer the Ph.D. degree in education and religion. The Ed.D. degree has been offered since 1974.

A remarkable number of new graduate degree programs in professional areas have been developed during the five-year period, programs which in substantial ways have the potential

to change the face of Adventist education and, thereby, the work of the church around the world. New master's programs include medical technology, nursing administration, dietetics and interdisciplinary studies in the School of Graduate Studies; pastoral ministry and Hispanic ministry in the Theological Seminary; and administrative arts—an interdisciplinary program offered by the School of Business as an alternative to the master of business administration degree which the university has offered since 1965. In addition, approval was received in January of this year for Andrews to offer the full professional program in physical therapy leading to the master's degree. The new degree program is unique in the State of Michigan and to Adventist education, and is one of only 13 similar programs in the United States. The first class of 26 students will begin coursework at Andrews on July 8, 1985.

In an effort to advance the educational program of the church world-wide, Andrews regularly grants degrees at overseas schools through affiliation arrangements, and offers a variety of extension programs. New affiliations effected in the last five years include Solusi College in Zimbabwe, and Newbold College in England. New extension programs established include the master of arts in teaching degree at three North American Division colleges; and the master of arts in pastoral ministry at key locations in several union conferences.

Enrollment figures for the period reflect the pattern occurring nationally in higher education. Economic recession and a shrinking educational market were key factors to a decline in the middle years, but an aggressive marketing program launched by the university in the fall of 1982 brought about a recovery in the 1984-1985 school year. The following chart of headcount enrollment and full-time equivalents tells the story well:

The appeal and availability of an Andrews education for Adventists overseas has increased markedly. While the university's comprehensive opening and closing enrollments for the five-year period remained virtually static, international student enrollment increased by 17 percent, reaching 727 students this year and accounting for 24 percent of the total university enrollment. Recent figures published in the *Chronicle of Higher Education* show that among all U.S. colleges and universities with enrollments greater than 2,500 students, Andrews ranks third highest in the nation for its percentage of foreign students.

The Theological Seminary took some major steps during the five-year period. A new tuition plan was established in 1983, making a seminary education affordable to a much larger group within the church. At the same time, the seminary instituted a major curriculum revision, integrating an intensive practical orientation with the traditional academic program. The Institute of Church Ministry and the Center for Continuing Education in Ministry were established, and the Institute of Archaeology began long-term excavations at a new site in Jordan. During the five-year period, 512 Master of Divinity degrees were awarded by the seminary to students who will, to a large degree, shape the future of the Adventist ministry.

In the fall of 1984, a new facility was completed to house the architecture department and administrative offices for the College of Technology. A new men's residence hall, University Towers, was completed in 1982.

The quinquennium has seen substantial growth in Andrews' outreach activities and auxiliary programs that advance the work of the church. The Institute of Alcoholism and Drug Dependency was formed in 1984 in cooperation with the General Conference and in affiliation with the national and international drug prevention

organizations. The Adventist Information Ministry, a campus-based telephone-answering and computer service industry, was established in 1982. Students are employed around the clock answering calls from people who see the Andrews toll-free number on television broadcasts of the *It Is Written* and *Breath of Life* programs, and in virtually all church-produced evangelistic literature. Records and follow-up information for these contacts are handled through the university's computer center. The student missionary program has been active during the past five years with more than 80 appointments around the world filled by Andrews students. Hundreds of other students have participated in annual volunteer construction projects sponsored by the university chapter of Maranatha Flights International. This past year the university community raised nearly \$20,000 for use by the Adventist Development and Relief Agency in Ethiopia and other drought-stricken African countries.

God has richly blessed Andrews University in the days since the last General Conference Session. We are confident that, with His continued leading, the days before the next session will be even brighter.

Andrews Professor Features G.C.

In what may seem like a nine-day marathon game of trivial pursuit to non-editors, Kermit Netteburg, associate professor of journalism at Andrews, spent his time at the General Conference Session organizing hundreds of facts from notes gathered by newsroom interns, from his own interview notes and from articles written by other newsroom staff.

The final product was 13 different articles on imaginative subjects such as the northernmost and southernmost delegates attending the session and the number of different languages spoken in Seventh-day Adventist churches around the world. Netteburg was appointed General Conference feature

writer and released information to local media, wire services and denominational media.

Finding the detailed information necessary for good feature articles was no small task. It meant walking miles throughout the Superdome looking for people, conducting interviews, deciphering notes, and studying local newspapers to find what their editors liked to print. It also meant keeping an eye open for interesting details, asking hundreds of questions, solving problems, and sitting for hours in front of a typewriter on the third level in the Superdome's Sports Hall of Fame.

Netteburg found producing so much copy in a crowded, temporary newsroom particularly demanding. He spent most of his time organizing the information flowing over the features desk, with the help of several other newsroom staff.

An interesting feature often started out with a good idea triggered by common sense and experience. Knowing that delegates came to the session from all over the world, it was easy to imagine there were delegates whose homes were thousands of miles apart but were now attending the same meetings in New Orleans. After consulting a world atlas, two division officers and making arrangements, the northernmost delegate from Batsfjord, Norway, met the southernmost delegate, from Christchurch, South New Zealand.

Other stories came because Netteburg kept a sharp eye open for the unusual. While working on an article about the unique means of transportation delegates used to reach New Orleans, he saw a young couple standing at the information desk. They were dressed in jeans, carrying backpacks, sleeping bags, and tents. Answers to Netteburg's questions revealed the couple had flown from their hometown in Germany and were taking a backpacking vacation in the U.S.

While looking for a story to send out on the Fourth of July, Netteburg pursued features that would focus on the changes occurring since World War II

ended forty years ago. What he found was a pastor living near Guadalcanal who lives with reminders of the war every day. The church school bell there is a World War II gas cylinder. The pastor revealed he still has to be careful even burning the trash in his yard. One time a fire set off a stack of buried ammunitions and left an eight-foot crater in his yard.

Delegates went to General Conference Session to attend business meetings and help with their division booths. But as Netteburg's efforts reveal, the General Conference would not have been complete without the time and talents of others who were so busy working they had no time to sit through one business meeting.

Andrews has high profile at G.C.

Andrews University maintained a high profile at the 54th General Conference Session according to Wesley Flory, then acting administrator for public relations and development.

Flory, who supervised university representation at the session said, "I don't think there was anyone at the General Conference Session who didn't know Andrews University was also there—in force. We were very visible."

According to Flory, a key element of the university's visibility was a sturdy, give-away plastic bag distributed to the thousands of visitors throughout the 10-day conference. The blue and white bag, designed by Peter Erhard, associate professor of art, contained a striking abstract design on one side and a full panel of university promotional copy prepared by the public relations department on the other side.

Flory said he received many testimonials from grateful attendees about the usefulness of the bags. "And fortunately" he said, "there weren't a dozen other institutions there all handing out the same item. It wasn't like camp meeting where you can usually take your pick among several fans promoting any number of causes. I think we were the only ones with bags."

Flory said the central focus of the university's representation at the session was a booth containing an "image well" slide program and a large color-photo display. The image well is a special structure for showing a multi-image program on a small area. Using a 45-degree directional mirror, the image is projected onto the ceiling and then reflected into a large floor mirror. This technique creates an illusion of depth, as though the image is several feet below the floor—hence the term image well.

"It's a new means of multi-image projection and one that worked well for us in the space constraints at the session," said Richard Dower, instructor in the technology education department. Dower, who designed and built the portable image well, modeled the structure after an "image-pit" developed by Kodak.

The slide show itself, a three-minute presentation describing the influence of Andrews graduates around the world, was produced under Dower's direction by media technology students Jon Anderson and Errol Mang. Flory estimated that the show, which took about five minutes to run and recycle, ran continuously for 10-12 hours each day of the session, and

was watched by more than 10,000 people. "During that whole time, the equipment never missed a beat," he said. "No bulbs blew out, and not a single slide jammed. It worked flawlessly."

In addition to the image well, the Andrews booth also featured a large color photo display, changed each day to feature different departments and schools within the university. The booth was staffed on rotation shifts by Andrews administrators who answered questions and distributed university materials.

Still another major feature of Andrews' representation at the session was President Richard Leshner's 11-minute videotape report of university progress during the last five years. In addition, the alumni office organized a Mississippi river boat ride on the evening of July 4, according to Nancy Flory, alumni director. More than 250 university alumni and friends gathered on the paddlewheeler to socialize and enjoy the New Orleans' holiday fireworks.

Official university delegates to the session included Richard Leshner; Edward Wines, vice president for financial administration; Gerhard Hasel, seminary dean; David Faehner, vice president for university ad-



Graduates Serve Around the World

Students and graduates from Andrews University register a profound influence on the work of the church around the world. The latest count shows that of the university's 15,000 living alumni, more than

2,100 are living and working in other countries, either as nationals who have returned to their homelands, or church workers on mission appointment.

Students Serve While They Study

Andrews students have many opportunities to serve the church while they are still in school. In the past five years, more than 80 Student Missionary appointments around the globe have been filled by Andrews University students. In 1982, the General Conference and the university established the Adventist Information Ministry, an evangelistic telephone-answering and computer service industry on campus. Students are employed around the clock answering calls from people who see the Andrews toll-free number on church television programming and want to know more about Adventists. In addition, hundreds of Andrews students have volunteered time on annual mission construction projects in Central America and the Caribbean, sponsored by the university chapter of Maranatha Flights International.

Students Come From Around the World

Students come from every part of the world to study at Andrews University. At last count, 88 nations of the earth were represented in the student body. Since the last General Conference Session in 1980, international student enrollment has increased by 17 percent, totalling 727 students during 1984-85 and accounting for 24 percent of the total university enrollment. Recent figures published in the Chronicle of Higher Education show that among all U.S. colleges and universities with enrollments greater than 2,500 students, Andrews University ranks third highest in the nation for its percentage of foreign students.

Andrews Has Global Reach for Church Education Program

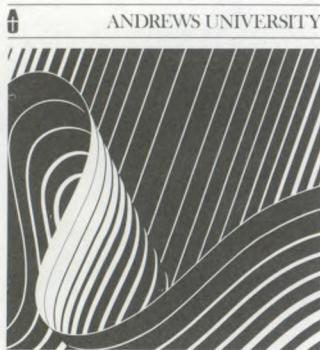
Andrews plays a leading role in the world-wide educational program of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Affiliation arrangements with Adventist colleges in other countries allow many overseas students to earn Andrews University degrees in their homelands. Present degree-granting affiliations include the University of Eastern Africa in Kenya, the Adventist Seminary of West Africa in Nigeria, Newbold College in England, Helderberg College in South Africa and Solusi College in Zimbabwe. In addition to these direct affiliations Andrews regularly offers extension programs in specific degree areas at numerous Adventist colleges in the United States and overseas.

On the Andrews campus in Southwestern Michigan, students may choose from more than 90 baccalaureate degree

majors offered by the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Technology, the School of Business and the School of Education. Graduate programs on the master's and doctoral level are offered in the School of Graduate Studies, School of Business, School of Education and Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary.

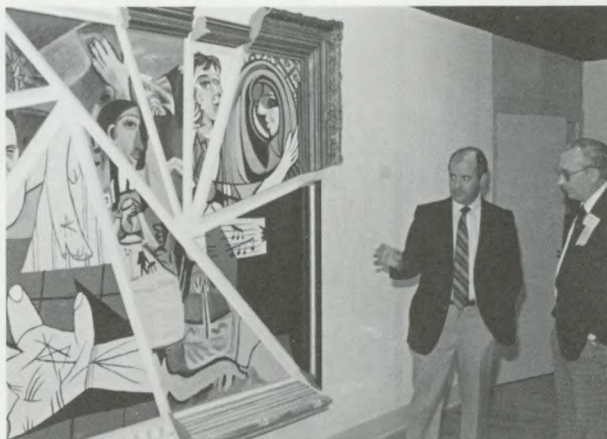

A LETTER FROM A LITTLE GIRL

An Exchange of Letters

Editor's Note: A few weeks ago Connie Green, our editorial secretary, astounded me by volunteering to organize my files. While it is a fact of life that some people will volunteer to do the most outrageous things, it came as a special surprise to know that we had one of those people working in our office. My files had been battered, plundered and abused for months, but Connie struggled ahead undaunted. In the course of her sorting and discarding, she showed me a folder containing two letters. They comprised a simple exchange of correspondence two years ago between our office and a little girl from Eldridge, Iowa named Stacey Andrews. I remembered with a stab of remorse that we had intended to print this material several issues ago. The reason we didn't may have something to do with why Connie is organizing my files now.

Dear Stacey:

Your letter came to my office today, and for a little while, we did not know exactly how to answer it. You see, Andrews is not really a town, by itself. It is actually a university near the village of Berrien Springs. But because Andrews University is like a town in many ways, I think you might be interested in learning more about it.

Your letter is addressed to the mayor. Andrews University does not have a mayor, but we do have a president. He is away on a trip right now and I will do my best to answer your questions. You ask how many schools are

here. Well, as you can see, Andrews is one big school itself. It is run by the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Besides being a university, Andrews also operates an elementary school (kindergarten through grade eight) and a high school. These are right next to the university, just a few hundred yards away. This means that if somebody wanted to go to Seventh-day Adventist schools in Berrien Springs, he could start in kindergarten, then go through eight years of elementary school, four years of high school, four years of college, one or two years for a master's degree and three or four years of a doctoral degree

—all in the space of a few blocks. Andrews has many people. There are nearly 3000 students in the university, 270 in the high school and 385 in the elementary school. And of course there are hundreds and hundreds of people who work for Andrews—teachers, gardeners, carpenters, electricians, farmers (Andrews has a dairy with more than 300 cows), doctors, preachers, secretaries, janitors, vice presidents, computer programmers, librarians, policemen, accountants, business managers—and even people like me who answer letters like yours.

Is Andrews University polluted?

Well, we don't think so. The water we drink is clean and the air we breathe is clear. And because Andrews University is a Seventh-day Adventist school we try to do more than just keep our surroundings clean. We also try to make good, clean, honest, useful people, too. We teach people not to pollute themselves with poor habits, or bad ideas, or bad attitudes about their neighbors. In fact, our whole purpose as a university is to prepare people for the day when Jesus will come back and make all things good and clean again. Then there will never be any more pollution.

You might like to know why this school is named Andrews, Stacey. It is named after a man

Editor's Note—again: Just for fun I called Stacey Andrews a few weeks ago. I found myself speaking to a bright, quick, articulate 12-year-old entirely unintimidated by a slick P.R. man from some big university. Yes, she received the university viewbook and four-color poster we sent her two years ago, and she had meant to write us and thank us. She wants to be a lawyer someday, but right now she is more concerned with entering seventh grade this fall at North Scott Junior High. She has a seventeen-year-old brother who attends North Scott Senior High. Her father is a manager for a truck leasing firm and her mother works in a bank.

In my own cautious and formal way, I asked Stacey if her family "was associated with any particular religious denomination." There was a pause on the line and she finally said: "You mean—like a church?"

I blushed and said, "Yes—like a church."

"Well," she said, "we go to the Parkview Lutheran church, if

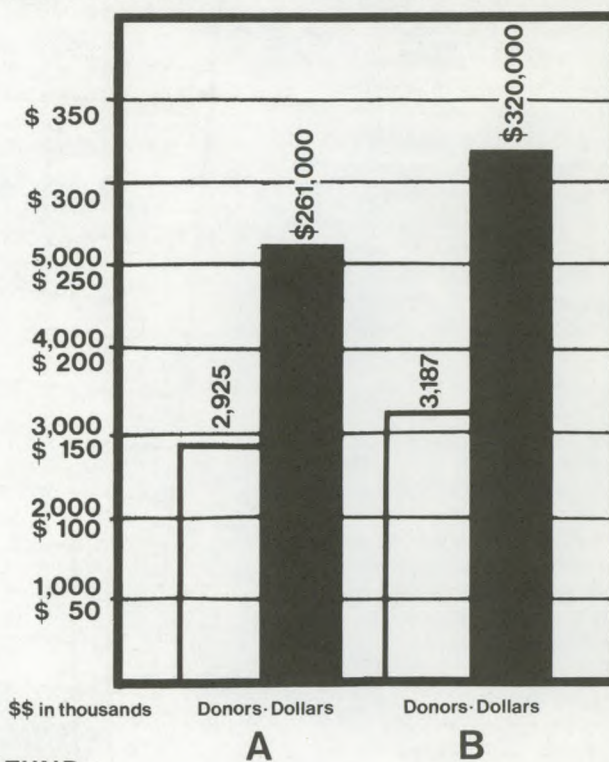
Andrews Alumni Top 1984-85 BECA and Annual Fund Goals

Andrews alumni celebrated the fifth and final year of the BECA I challenge program by exceeding BECA donor and Annual Fund dollar goals. Record participation by the 1985 senior class and by faculty calling alumni during the department phonathon were key factors in the success of the campaign.

The 1985 senior class set records in both participation and size of donation. Led by president Bob Burnette 95% of the class donated \$10.00 apiece,

to qualify Andrews for \$26,000 in BECA challenge grants. Unrestricted donations from all alumni exceeded the \$250,000 goal by \$11,000. The percent of alumni participating in both groups exceed national averages for private colleges and universities.

Faculty making personal contact with 3,039 alumni during the departmental phonathon contributed to the success and added a new dimension to the campaign, according to Nancy Anderson-Flory, Alumni and Annual Fund Director. Alumni responded with \$62,373.00 in unrestricted gifts, nearly one-

doubling the gift size of previous classes. The 95% participation qualifies the class for an additional \$500 grant from BECA and sets a precedent for future classes, according to Burnette.

Twenty-five hundred and forty (29.6%) undergraduate alumni responded to phone calls and letters by contributing \$220,239.00 in unrestricted gifts

third of the BECA goal. The 17 qualifying departments will receive budget credit for equal portions of \$13,000 of the BECA challenge grant.

In the College of Arts and Sciences the English Department led in total dollars received followed by Biology, Chemistry, Religion, History, Home Economics and Business Education all raising over one

thousand dollars each. Teacher education graduates responded with \$5,000. Agriculture in the College of Technology raised almost \$2,000 and graduates of the School of Business contributed nearly \$2,500. Alumni contacted in May by student callers gave an additional \$8,000, pushing the total to the \$220,000 goal.

Faculty also reported intangible rewards from participating in the phonathon. According to S. Saliba, "General response from the alumni was very positive. It was very encouraging. Phonathon provides a tremendous opportunity for the department, school or college to touch base with alumni; what's happening here; how we can improve our classes to make them more helpful to the students. It's tremendous public relations over and above the money."

First Five Years of BECA Boosts Alumni Giving

A major fundraising incentive program established five years ago by the General Conference has increased unrestricted contributions to Andrews from undergraduate alumni by more than 85 percent, according to Nancy Anderson-Flory, director of alumni.

Mrs. Anderson-Flory said the remarkable increase has brought Andrews' total of unrestricted alumni support for the five-year period to more than \$1.17 million, in a program that saw steady year-by-year increases in the number and amount of alumni contributions.

This past year (1984-85), Andrews received more than \$220,000 in unrestricted alumni gifts, comparing favorably with the \$117,000 received during the first year of the incentive program.

The program, called the Business Executives Challenge to Alumni, was established in 1980 through the Philanthropic Services department of the General Conference. Twelve business leaders, interested in raising the percentage of alumni support for Adventist colleges, contributed to a fund used to provide incentive grants to the various schools. At the time the

program was established, the national average of alumni contributing to private education stood at 24 percent of the total alumni field. The average for Adventist colleges was one quarter that figure—approximately 6.5 percent.

During the five-year period at Andrews, the number of alumni donors making unrestricted contributions has increased by 160 percent, according to Mrs. Anderson-Flory, jumping from 964 in 1980-81 to more than 2,500 in 1984-85. Overall alumni donors, making either unrestricted or restricted contributions to Andrews, increased by 160 percent, climbing from 1,236 in 1980-81 to nearly 3,200 this past year. Undergraduate alumni participation in the annual fund now stands at 30 percent of the total alumni field.

Prompting these remarkable increases were the incentive grants provided by the BECA program. Grants were given to Andrews for reaching goals in the total amount of unrestricted funds contributed, and for the number of donors participating in the annual fund campaign. In all, Andrews received more than \$275,000 in BECA incen-

tive grants during the five-year period.

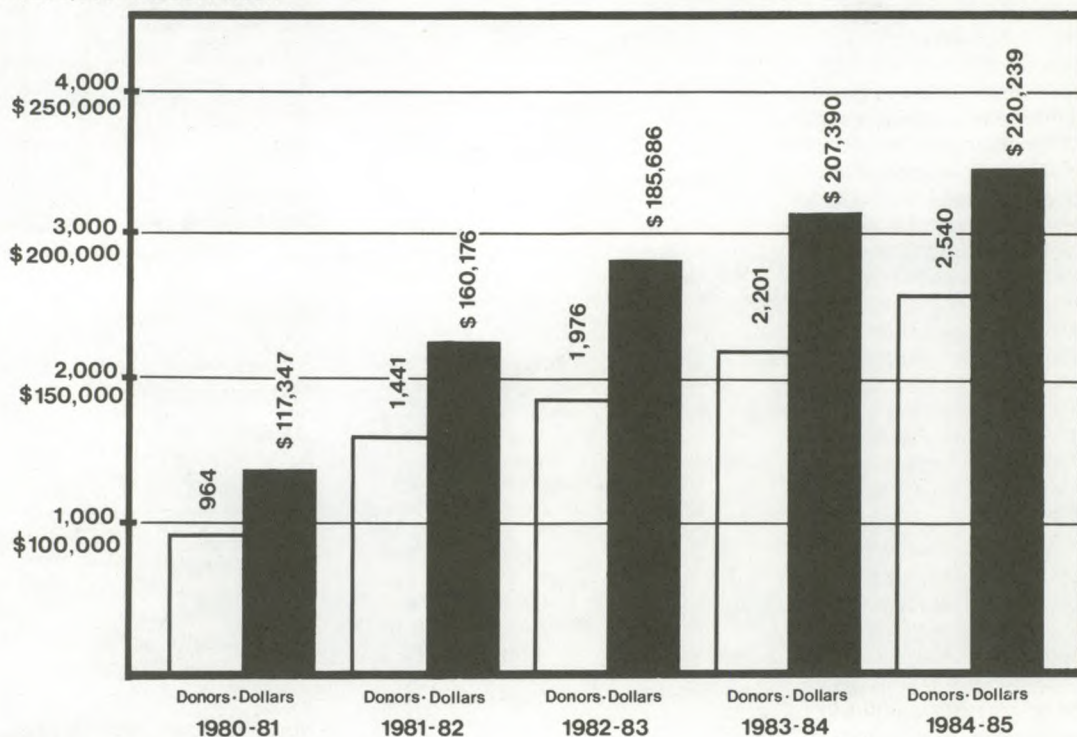
The BECA incentive grants have been used for several specific projects on campus, according to Mrs. Anderson-Flory. University officials channeled nearly \$160,000 toward the construction of a new building that will eventually house the university's computer operations. That building was completed in December, 1984 and is temporarily occupied by the architecture department until permanent quarters are constructed to house all departments of the College of Technology.

Redecoration of the student lounge, completed this fall, was accomplished with the help of \$50,000 from the BECA incentive funds. First established in the early 1960s when the Campus Center was opened, the student lounge until this year was still wearing its original paint, carpet and furniture. More than twenty years of active student use took its toll, and for several years the view has been widely shared that the lounge was due for a major face lift. Returning students this fall will no doubt be surprised

and pleased with the new look. Another \$30,000 of the BECA incentive grant money helped by a fleet of more than 70 Zenith micro computers to be used in a new student learning center and in various academic departments on campus.

In a particularly creative use of some of the BECA grant funds, the alumni office used \$10,500 as incentive money to encourage academic departments to participate in the 1983-84 annual fund phonathon. This year, 17 departments are sharing \$13,000 for contacting alumni who pledged more than \$60,000 during the 1984-85 annual fund phonathon. (See accompanying story.)

Departments are using the incentive money for many different projects, depending on departmental needs, according to Mrs. Anderson-Flory. The home economics department will purchase a new computer or some audio visual equipment. The religion department is looking forward to a new photo copy machine. Undergraduate biology students will benefit from new lab equipment purchased with the grants.

Teacher education students will make good use of new video-taping equipment and computer software. The School of Business will use its award money to put student clubs on a firm financial base. The music department channeled its share toward the Wind Ensemble's tour of Europe this past summer.

Through special programs and activities like the departmental phonathon, the BECA program has greatly increased the university's contact and communication with its alumni, according to Mrs. Anderson-Flory. More than 5,000 alumni were contacted personally by Andrews people in the last two years, through the phonathon alone. In addition, the BECA program has inspired the university to begin an aggressive class agent program. Graduates from each class or a group of classes are being selected to send personal letters of class news and appeals for the alumni fund to their former classmates.

The alumni chapter program is being revived, with annual trips by university personnel to meet with various groups of alumni around the country. Recent trips sponsored by the alumni office featured Dr. Lawrence T. Geraty, then with the Institute of Archaeology (now president of Atlantic Union College) at a series of weekend meetings in Florida which attracted more than 1,000 alumni and friends. Several hundred California alumni met with President and Mrs. Leshner during meetings in March in Loma Linda and St. Helena/Angwin. Andrews alumni in the Loma Linda chapter volunteered to contact more than 250 alumni in that area as part of the annual fund phonathon.

With the results of what the BECA program has done for Andrews and Adventist education so obvious to even the most casual observer, alumni can expect the university to place an especially high priority on alumni affairs and concerns in the years ahead.
