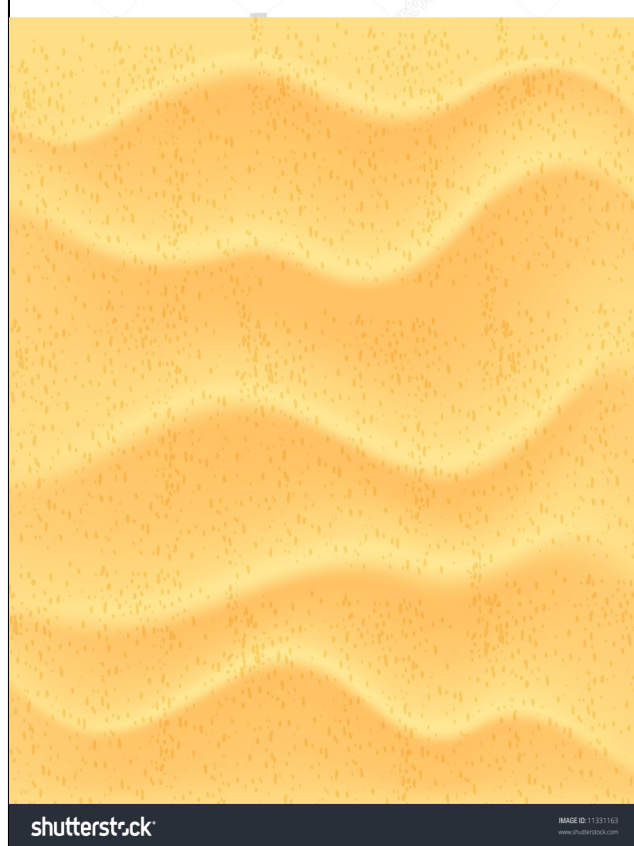
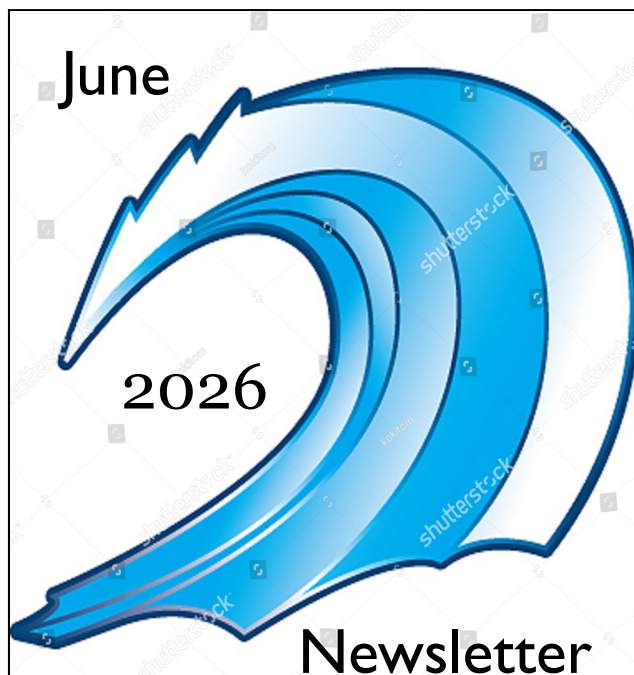

Please Note: If you have a balance of \$50 or more after the 10th of the month, you will receive a late fee and there will be a hold placed on your account.



If you have mail that is not addressed to you and/or members of your household, please bring that to the office regularly. We will take care of it. It is a Federal offense to hold onto the mail of someone else.



Please note: If it is addressed to "Resident" or "Occupant," that means you. If you do not want it, you may dispose of it.

When placing a work order with the office, please keep in mind two things:



1. The office workers do not generally know when the technician will go to your apartment to fix something. They go as soon as they are able to go. If it is a plumbing or electrical issue, the technician is from a different department so the office personnel may not even see the technician.
2. The office workers are not always told immediately that something has been fixed so if your repair has not been fixed within a reasonable amount of time, kindly give a reminder call to the office.



The weather is certainly warming up now. Some of you may be feeling that your apartment is really hot. Here's an option: **Though our office does not offer any for sale or rent,** personal air conditioners may be used. An extra charge of \$20 per month for the electricity will be added to apartment rent during the months of June, July, and August if there is a unit in your window. The charges will be incurred whether the air conditioner is used or not. If you will not be using your unit and do not wish to pay the extra charge, please remove the air-conditioner from your window. Units requiring 220 volt circuits may be used in Garland apartments only. Beechwood and Maplewood apartments will handle 115 volt units only.

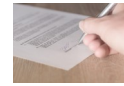
PLUMBING:

Have you turned in a 30-day notice? If not, there may be a \$50 improper checkout fee assessed on your account.



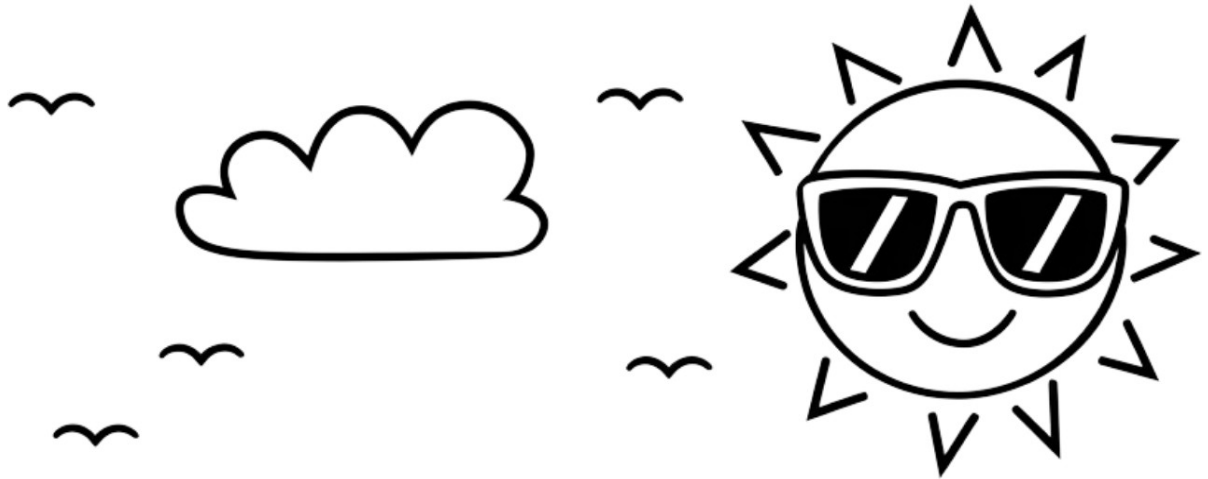
Rent will be charged for a minimum of 30 days after we are informed that you are moving.
