Please Note: If you have a balance of \$50 or more after the 10th of the month, you will receive a late fee and there will be a hold placed on your account.

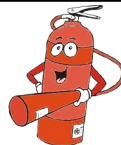


Lastly, excessive speed of cars along the roads beside/behind the apartments and in the parking lots is very dangerous as someone could run/ride out in front of a car at any time. Please be sure to drive slowly and cautiously so as to ensure the safety of everyone in and around the apartments.



Fire Safety Instructions (in summary). **You could receive a fine if rules are violated:**

1. Check your smoke detectors regularly. If you need a new battery, please come get one at the office.
2. **Everything** must be kept inside your apartment and/or your storage box. **Nothing is to be in** the hallways, stairways, walkways, or the storage room common area.
3. Watch your pots/pans/dishes when you are cooking and/or baking.
4. The following are not allowed:
 - a. Burning of candles
 - b. Portable or space heaters
 - c. Halogen lamps
 - d. Combustible liquids (anything that can catch fire, such as gasoline)



Please do not put wipes of any kind (even "flushables") down the toilet. Our plumbing will not handle it and you will end up with a clogged toilet. Thank you.

Rent will be charged for a minimum of 30 days after we are informed that you are moving.

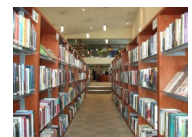
If your lease has not expired, you will have to find someone to take over your lease or pay rent through the expiration of your lease.
