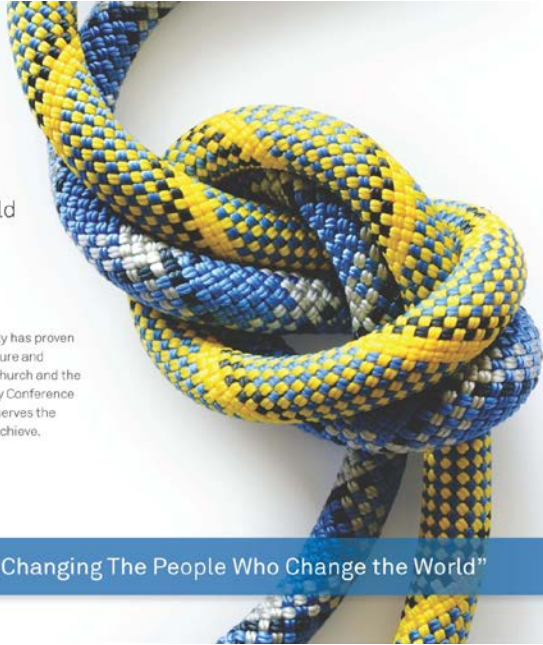

They examined a study done by the North American Division Research Center on attitudes and perspectives regarding DMin education, discussed vision for DMin education, heard and responded to an assessment report, processed a strategic plan for DMin education, examined the research modalities applied in DMin education, and discussed theological formation in DMin education. The group also interacted with coordinators on practical matters of delivery and quality.
