New Director Welcomed to the DMin Program

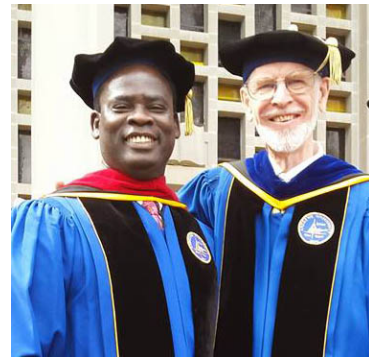


Dr. Bruce Bauer has taught in the Department of World Mission at the Seminary for many years, and is currently the chair of that department. In addition to his work at the Seminary, he has given years of mission service in Southeast Asia. His wife, Linda, has also had a role in the DMin program, serving as one of the technical editors for DMin project manuscripts for international cohorts. Due to their past and ongoing activities in education and ministry in far-reaching locations, they are experienced world travelers.

Dr. Bauer is the chairperson of the DMin Admissions sub-committee and as of May 1, 2015, he assumed the responsibility of interim director for the Doctor of Ministry program, following Skip Bell's fifteen years of service as program director. Among other things Dr. Bauer is involved in beyond his roles with the University, he serves on the board of Adventist Frontier Missions.

Spring Commencement at Andrews

The Doctor of Ministry program had a strong representation at the May 3, 2016 commencement ceremonies on the Andrews campus. Seventeen ministry professionals were conferred with doctoral degrees. Pastors, administrators, evangelists, departmental directors and a chaplain were among the group. Graduates were from several states in the U.S. including Alaska, California, Connecticut, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Ohio, and Texas. The countries of Brazil, Malawi, Nigeria, and the United Kingdom were also represented.

Stephen Yeagley Receives Award

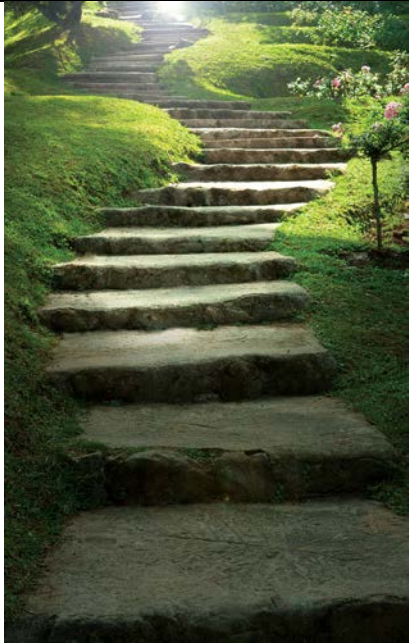


Once each year, a team of Seminary professors meets to select one outstanding Doctor of Ministry project to receive special recognition with the **Excellence in Doctor of Ministry Research Award**. In addition to a special certificate, the award also involves a monetary acknowledgement of the honoree's accomplishment.

This year's award goes to Stephen Yeagley, for his project entitled *"Teaching Media Literacy as a Pastoral Skill for Seventh-day Adventist Seminary Students."*

Dr. Yeagley received his degree conferral at the Andrews University commencement ceremonies in May, 2015. He resides in Berrien Springs, Michigan, and is employed at Andrews University where he serves as Assistant Vice President for Student Life.
