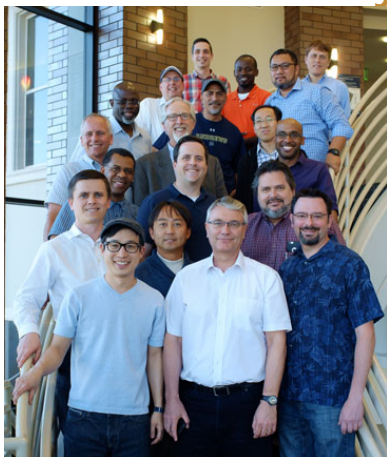
- Foster shared vision for church renewal
