## Change in Writing Style for DMin Project

The DMin Program Committee has voted to implement a new writing style for DMin projects, beginning in January of 2018. Since 2007, the program has used the APA style. The committee has decided that it will be a benefit for the students if we move to Turabian Parenthetical. This is a form of Turabian that uses in-text citation and a reference list, not footnotes. It is felt that this new style will simplify the citation process for our participants. The new style will be effective for cohorts that launch in 2018 and beyond. Participants who began the program in 2017 or earlier may complete their projects using APA.

Between now and next January, a revised writing manual is being developed for the DMin program that will include those parts of *Andrews University Standards for Written Work* that pertain to our program, and the Turabian Parenthetical style.
