Did you know...

...the Doctor of Ministry was the first doctorate to be offered by Andrews University? It was the first degree of its kind to be accredited by any college in Michigan. Initiated in the summer term of 1973 as a full-time, one-year program, graduates were conferred with their degrees in August of 1974 to Edwin English, Elwood Staff, and John Kroncke. After just three years of existence it was one of only seven DMin programs in the entire country to be designated as fully accredited with no reservations by the Association of Theological Schools.

Today, ATS accredits over 270 universities and seminaries, many of which offer DMin degrees. The program at Andrews is not only one of the first ATS-accredited DMin programs, but remains among those with the largest enrollment. What started as a generalized program has continued to evolve, offering a generous selection of concentrations to meet the needs of ministering in current culture.

Online Registration for DMin Participants

We encourage program participants to use Registration Central to enter your own course registration. This puts you in control of your own registration, keeps you in current student status without interruption in access to University status, and keeps student loans in deferred status. Remember, although the DMin program structure consists of year-long study modules, we have to fit within the University's semester structure. For this reason, registration must be renewed each semester, and not just in the semesters containing the intensive portion of your year's study. Stories from DMin Alumni



Last month we invited DMin alumni to share their stories since finishing their DMin. One of the persons who responded is John Macharia Gichuri, who serves as Director of Education and Chaplaincy for the East Kenya Union Conference. Here is his message, slightly edited for brevity:

"I am a proud alumnus of the Andrews University [Global Mission Leadership] cohort that graduated in 2015 (extension campus, Adventist University of Africa). I am using the skills learned in the [DMin program] to continue mentoring young boys and girls and to provide Adventist Functional Substitutes for initiation rites of passage. This is the 11th year I am doing

this and it is getting better and larger every year. I started the program in 2007 in the district that hosts Adventist University of Africa with only eight boys. The program is now in six counties of Kenya and close to 1,000 boys and 400 girls have benefited from the program. (For) the program this year we hope to serve close to 400 boys and 200 girls...I am now working closely with the East Kenya Union Conference Youth Director to see whether the manual I developed [during my DMin studies] could be adopted to be part of the material used during this important stage of development in our boys and girls.”
