Coming in summer and fall 2018



FAMILY MINISTRY is forming a new cohort now under the leadership of Dr. David Sedlacek. Intensives will be at the Andrews University campus in July. The application deadline is May 25.



DISCIPLESHIP (Spanish) is forming a new cohort to be conducted in the North American Division with the first-year intensives to be at the Andrews University campus in September. The concentration coordinator is Dr. Kleber Gonçalves. The application deadline is July 30.



INTERGENERATIONAL CHURCH is a brand-new concentration, developed under the leadership of Dr. Steve Case in consultation with the ministry professionals in his current Youth and Young Adult Ministry cohort. The first-year intensives will be at Riverside, California in October. The application deadline is July 30.

Online Registration for DMin Participants

We encourage program participants to use Registration Central to enter your own course registration. This puts you in control of your own registration, keeps you in current student status without interruption in access to University status, and keeps student loans in deferred status. Remember, although the DMin program structure consists of year-long study modules, we have to fit within the University's semester structure. For this reason, registration must be renewed each semester, and not just in the semesters containing the intensive portion of your year's study. Stories from DMin Alumni



We appreciate hearing from our program alumni. Alumnus Dale Wolcott shared with us what he has been doing since completing his degree.

"I received my DMin in 1998. My thesis was *Development of an Adventist Community Services Center to Serve*

Navajo Residents of Kayenta, Arizona. The focus was on community service as a church planting methodology on the Navajo Indian Reservation. I left Native work in 1999 and returned to "conventional" pastoring. But that project's focus on community interaction prepared the way for seven fulfilling years in chaplaincy with Florida Hospital beginning in 2006. We were called back to the Navajo Reservation on a post-retirement basis in 2014 and have been here since."

Since returning to serve the Navajo in Chinle, Arizona and the surrounding area in 2014, Dr. Wolcott and his wife have been involved in restoring a church building that had fallen into disrepair, conducting health, addiction, and Bible study seminars, children's programs, weddings, baptisms and much more.
