1. The Urban Ministry Program defines the pathway of discipleship in the city - Serve. Act with compassion. Relate. Build community. Live in faith. Believe.
2. Millions of people in the city will not listen to the Gospel when presented through traditional evangelism.
3. The city is different. The cultural context and worldview of a city differs from the rural and small town experience that has shaped culture over many decades.
4. The city is where people are. Human population in North America, and around the globe, is rapidly shifting to city contexts.
5. Young professionals, adults of varied backgrounds and economic groups, including Christian young adults are typically settling in the city.
6. Healthy congregations in the city form around relationships, service, community, spirituality, worship, belief, and transformation. They encourage thought, dialogue, reflection, and questions.
