ROLE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

HEALTHY FAMILIES: BUILDING A STRONG FOUNDATION

Why are we here today, discussing domestic violence?

✓It happens in our communities

 \checkmark US estimates range between 25-40% of women experience DV in their lifetimes

✓ About 10% of US males experiencer DV

 \checkmark Up to 80% of women experience it worldwide

✓ Male worldwide estimates unknown

✓It happens in our churches

- ✓NAD study by Rene D. Drumm 33.8% of women, 20.1% of men experienced DV (N=1,431)
- \checkmark LUC study 42% of women self-identified as survivors, 33% indicated their abuser was also SDA (N=126)
- ✓ Unmeasured effects on children, families, congregations and communities

WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

We've already...

- 1. Made a statement about families, their importance and our need to protect them
- 2. Made a statement about family violence, and one about violence against women and girls

Work with perpetrators

Session with Bradley Hinman this afternoon

>Three years of working with perpetrators, because Jesus is interested in everyone's salvation

>Work with Local Agencies

- Find your DV shelters
- >Hold meetings at your church
- >Donate/make supplies for survivors and their families
- >Offer a "spa day" for the women while someone takes care of the kids

Work with local schools

>Offer teen dating violence awareness

>Early prevention techniques for teaching about healthy marriages

Start a support group for students impacted by DV or TDV

Raise awareness in your community

>Local news/radio broadcasts

Fundraising

Homeless population – large part are now women and children escaping abusive homes

Work with law enforcement
Know what the church's responsibilities are
Ask how else you can be involved

TAILOR THE WORK, BECAUSE ONE SIZE DOES NOT FIT ALL!

Culture matters

 Ethnic variables: Gender role beliefs, American and Hispanic acculturation, language

✓ Religiosity: church attendance, "liberality"

✓Our religion takes place in our ethnic culture

Prevention and intervention needs to take account of these influences and be tailored to these dynamics


