This session deals with using a small group, specifically as a church-sponsored program, to facilitate healing and integration for survivors of emotional, physical, and sexual abuse.

Therapeutic Objectives

- 1. Provide a safe, nonjudgmental environment where disclosure and healing can take place
- 2. Offer support and bonding with other abuse survivors
- 3. Help clients identify and own their emotions
- 4. Help clients come to understand that God truly loves them
- 5. Help clients to reach a point where they can forgive the perpetrator (note that forgiveness does not equal reconciliation)
- 6. Help clients to understand and begin to implement appropriate boundaries in their lives

The primary leader should be properly trained and licensed. Males should not be the primary leaders of groups for females, and vice versa.

You have an obligation to report to proper authorities if a group member is homicidal or suicidal, or if you have good reason to believe child abuse is occurring.

SUPPORT GROUP FOR FEMALE SURVIVORS OF ABUSE
