KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Scott Stanley, Ph.D.

Scott Stanley, Ph.D., is a research professor and co-director of the Center for Marital and Family Studies at the University of Denver. He has published widely with research interests including commitment, communication, conflict, confidence, risk factors for divorce, the prevention of marital distress, and couple development. Along with Dr. Howard Markman and colleagues, he has been involved in the research, development, and refinement of the Prevention and Relationship Enhancement Program (PREP) for over 25 years. Stanley and Markman are currently engaged in a long term study of the effectiveness of PREP disseminated in the community, funded by NICHD. They are also conducting a large, randomized trial of a variant

of PREP in the U.S. Army, also funded by NICHD; and Stanley, Galena Rhoades, and Howard Markman are conducting a longitudinal study of cohabitation and couple development, funded by NICHD. Stanley has authored or co-authored various books including Fighting for Your Marriage and The Power of Commitment. He is a founder of PREP and co-author of the Within Our Reach, an experiential-based curriculum for couples, and the Within My Reach, an experiential-based curriculum for individuals.



Roger Hernandez

The Ministerial and Evangelism Director for the Southern Union Conference (of SDA). He has served in the ministry for over 20 years. Some of his passions have included church plants, small group and youth ministries, and evangelistic work. Roger is a motivational speaker who has been part of events at the division, union, and conference levels. Born in Cuba, and fully bilingual, Pastor Hernandez has had the chance to be part of events in both English and Spanish. He is the author of five books, the most recent being Epic Fail, published in 2011. Roger's family includes his wife, Kathy, and four children Yessenia, Deisy, Vanessa & Jonathan.

Jeanne and Ray Hartwell

Jeanne and Ray Hartwell both grew up in Seventh-day Adventist homes and attended Adventist schools up through their college experience. They graduated from Southern Adventist University in May of 1978 and were married two weeks later. Over their years of ministry Ray and Jeanne have worked to make strong

couples and families in their congregations through both counseling and church programs and activities, and also through leading by example. Monte Sahlin

Monte Sahlin entered the ministry of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in 1970 and worked full time as an Adventist minister until early 2014 when he retired. He worked in urban ministry and as a pastor in Washington DC, Boston, Pittsburgh, Allentown and Columbus.

Sahlin served as a co-leader for Family Ministries in the Pennsylvania Conference and as director of Family Ministries while assistant to the president of the Ohio Conference, and then became the first Family Ministries Director for the newly constituted North American Division in January 1987. In 1998, when he became vice president of the Columbia Union Conference, he also served as director of the Family Ministries department until he returned to the Ohio Conference in early 2007.

The author of 24 books and 117 research monographs, Sahlin directed and wrote reports on two major studies of Adventist family life: A New Generation of Adventist Families and Adventist Families in North America.

Family life and ministry with families continue to be a research and writing interest of Sahlin. He regularly writes on the topic and related subjects for Adventist Today and on his blog (Faith in Context at www.montesahlin.com) and on Facebook. He also regularly conducts Webinars for the Center for Creative Ministry that is often related to family ministry.

Sahlin served as an adjunct instructor in the Doctor of Ministry program at Andrews University from 2007 through 2014. He was an associate faculty member in urban studies at the Tony Campolo Graduate School at Eastern University from 2000 through 2013. His college education was in theology and mass media at La Sierra University in 1970. He completed a Master of Community Mental Health at Windsor University in 1973. Married to Gretchen, Sahlin is the father of three adult daughters: Stephanie, Melissa Sahlin, and Najwa.

David Olsen, Ph.D.

David H. Olson, Ph.D. is Professor Emeritus, Family Social Science, University of Minnesota, St. Paul, MN and Founder and CEO of PREPARE/ENRICH.

He is past President of the National Council on Family Relations (NCFR) and the Upper Midwest Association of Marital and Family Therapists (UMAMFT). He has received over 10 national awards for his contributions from a variety of national organizations. Distinguished alumni awards from St. Olaf College, Penn. State University & University of Minnesota.

He developed the PREPARE/ENRICH Program, which has been taken by over 3 million couples and offices in 13 countries (8 different languages). He has written 20 books and over 100 articles in the field of marriage and family. Marriage & family textbook (7th edition) is used in over 850 colleges and universities. His most recent books include: Couple Checkup (2008) and Remarriage Checkup (2010).

He has appeared numerous times on national television including the NBC Today Show, CBS Morning Show, ABC Good Morning America and the Oprah Show.



Lael Caesar, Ph.D. & Lena Caesar, Ed.D., Ph.D.

Lael and Lena Caesar love each other, love their neighbors and their enemies, and love to work for God. Lena and Lael have authored scores of professional and scholarly articles in their respective fields and are in demand as speakers and seminar presenters. Their son, Lloyd, and daughter, La Vonne are both graduates of Andrews University.
