


Figure 1. Andrews sponsored activities that provided cross cultural experiences




Figure 2. Types of service activity involvement while at Andrews (n=377)




Figure 3. Frequency of service activities while at Andrews




Figure 4. Types of leadership activity involvement while at Andrews , (n=377)




Figure 5. Frequency of leadership activities while at Andrews (n=377)




Figure 6. Mission ratings, highest to lowest




Figure 7. Major ratings, highest to lowest




Figure 8. Spiritual Commitment ratings, highest to lowest

Demographics

- 383 seniors were surveyed, 377 completed the whole survey
- 55% of respondents were female
- 82% of respondents identified themselves as active Seventh-day Adventists
- 48% of respondents were 22 or 23 years old, while 25% were aged 21 or less.




Figure 9. Distribution of reported ethnic identity among seniors (n-360)

- 63% of respondents identified most closely with an ethnic group other than Caucasian (See figure 9 below)
- 18% of respondents were international students
- 17% of respondents were most fluent in a language other than English, or felt equally fluent in English and another language
- 58% of respondents studied primarily at an SDA academy, and 31% studied primarily at a public high school, before coming to Andrews University
- 9% of respondents said they would graduate as a J.N. Andrews Scholar
