Job Placement Information

First Destination Survey

The First Destination Survey asks graduates about their job placement and plans for enrollment in graduate school at the time of graduation. Numbers in this report will naturally be lower than those reported on the Alumni Survey, since the Alumni Survey asks students to report their employment and enrollment status at one year after graduation.

Employment & Enrollment at Graduation

The below chart shows aggregated results from three semesters worth of graduations per year.

2016 Alumni Survey

In spring of 2016, 2279 Andrews University alumni who had graduated in the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years were asked about their placement in a job or further studies one year after graduation, 450 (20%) of whom responded.

Furthermore,

- 68% of the 367 employed were in jobs “very related” and 20% were in jobs “somewhat related” to their Andrews degree
- 63% of the 78 enrolled in further studies were enrolled in programs “very related” and 28% were in programs “somewhat related” to their Andrews degree

The following is a detailed analysis of the continued education of Andrews' bachelor's graduates. Since graduating from Andrews

- 78 (39.2%) of the 199 bachelor's graduates have earned 79 additional degrees:
 - 12 bachelor's degrees
 - 51 master's degrees
 - 8 specialist degree
 - 8 doctoral degrees

2014 Alumni Survey

In spring of 2014, 1,471 Andrews University alumni who had graduated in the 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 school years were asked about their placement in a job or further studies one year after graduation, 240 (16%) of whom responded.

Furthermore,

- 66% of those employed were in jobs "very related" and 19% were in jobs "somewhat related" to their Andrews degree
- 65% of those enrolled in further studies were enrolled in programs "very related" and 28% were in programs "somewhat related" to their Andrews degree

In addition to enrollment one year after graduation, alumni were also asked about their current enrollment status and any other degrees they had earned since graduating from Andrews University. Since graduating from Andrews

- 56 (61.5%) of the 91 bachelor's graduates have pursued further studies
- 34 (37.4%) of the 91 bachelor's graduates have earned 35 additional degrees:
 - 27 master's degrees
 - 1 specialist degree
 - 7 doctoral degrees

2012 Alumni Survey

In spring of 2012, 547 Andrews University alumni (graduates in the 2006-2007 school year) were asked about their placement in a job or further studies one year after graduation. Of the 77 (14%) who responded,

- 89% were employed and/or enrolled in graduate study one year after graduation
 - 70% of those employed were in jobs “very related” and 21% were in jobs “somewhat related” to their Andrews degree
 - 68% of those enrolled in further studies were in programs “very related” and 26% were in programs “somewhat related” to their Andrews degree
