## Change of Status Instructions I-539 Application to Extend/Change Nonimmigrant Status while residing in the US

A change of status can be requested to change from one nonimmigrant category to another nonimmigrant category. Please see the form's instructions on the USCIS website (http://www.uscis.gov/) for the most upto-date information for how to complete the application.

- ✓ Check, money or postal order for the \$290 fee, payable to *US Department of Homeland Security*

- √ \$200 SEVIS online payment fee (<a href="https://www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/desktop/index.jsp?view=desktop">https://www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/desktop/index.jsp?view=desktop</a>).

  Send a copy of this payment receipt with your application.
- ✓ Photocopy of your passport ID page (biographic page)
- ✓ Copy of I-94. Available online: <a href="https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/194/request.html">https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/194/request.html</a>. If you have a white card I-94 in your passport, you can send a copy of front and back of it.
- ✓ Photocopy of visa and ID page from passport
- ✓ Photocopy of financial support documents
- ✓ Letter from you (the student) explaining reason for request and why you wish to change your status
- ✓ Admittance letter or acceptance letter from Andrews University
- ✓ Photocopy of your J1 DS2019 document
- ✓ Photocopy of your dependents J2 DS2019 documents

Note: If you are applying for a change of status from J1 to F1 – YOU ARE INELIGIBLE TO APPLY IF YOU ARE SUBJECT TO TWO-YEAR HOME-COUNTRY PHYSICAL PRESENCE REQUIREMENT [212(e)]
